An Introduction to Coin Grading



Coin Grading is a passion of mine, and has been since I started collecting at 9 years old. I've attended grading Seminars at coin shows, researched online, watched videos, read many articles, & asked coin dealers tons of questions in the past to acquire the little bit of knowledge I have now. If you are a numismatic hobbyist such as myself, or interested in coin collecting, having some knowledge of coin grading is a must if you plan to make a purchase of an uncertified coin for your collection.

Grading a coin is done for a couple of reasons: Sight Unseen Value & Authenticity. If you purchase a coin that has been slabbed & graded by a reputable Grading Service such as NGC, AGC, PCGS, or ANACS, you can purchase that coin with confidence without ever laying eyes on it. But! Buyer beware..... Flea markets, thrift stores, antique shops, etc..... If you see a coin in a 2x2 white holder with a grade written on the top, next to a Price..... That is simply the OPINION of grade/value of that seller. I carry a Photo Grading guide (*See Below) with me when I go coin picking at flea markets. If I see a coin I want, I will not buy it unless I absolutely agree with the sellers grade/cost. This book is available at Michaels or Barnes & Noble. Sometimes the seller will be willing to negotiate on the price with you if they see you have some knowledge. One obstacle I've observed is Pride. A lot of sellers will not admit they over graded a coin.... That's when you walk away.

Familiarize yourself with the coin you want to buy. Know what its rarity/mintage is (how many were made). Familiarize yourself with current market values for all the different grades. Ebay is the #1 guide for coin values. There, you can get real time current selling rates on most any coin. Study up on the Numismatic Grading scale as well. Know that the scale ranges from 1 to 70. A grade of Almost Good, AG-1 shows almost no detail on the coin, but the date is legible and enough detail is available to allow for identification of the coin. Mint State MS-70 defines a perfectly minted, fully detailed, flawless coin.

The best video discussion I've found on grading is available on YouTube. In your Google search engine type the following words to pull the video up: **PCGS Webinar – Coin Grading 101.** In this video, the speaker discusses Why Grade a coin, Elements of Grading Mint State & Circulated Coins, and he shows detailed examples of different coins and grades.
