LEGACY RIBBONS

LEGACY RIBBONS ARE COMING TO THE 2019 QUILT SHOW, "THE MAGIC OF QUILTS"

The Quilt Show Committee will be offering Legacy Ribbons at the 2019 Quilt Show "The Magic of Quilts". Legacy Ribbons may be in honor of an individual, a member of the guild or anyone who is special to you. A Legacy Ribbon may also be a memorial to a departed friend.

It's an exciting opportunity for individuals in our quilting community to recognize and honor the love of quilting and the people who practice the art.

The actual ribbon will be a special award designed just for Legacy Ribbons. It will be displayed on the selected quilt during the show, just as other ribbons are displayed. There will be a section in the program where Legacy Ribbons will be recognized with both the honoree and the donor named. For example "The Family of someone in memory of whoever" or The Friends of someone in her Honor." The ribbon will show the honoree and the donor as applicable. The donor of the ribbon may also make a prize available to the maker of the winning Quilt. It's not a requirement and not necessary but is an available option. The prize may take the form of a gift certificate or of a cash award. This is determined by the donor of the ribbon, not the WHQG or the Quilt Show Committee. The winning quilts will be selected by the donor of the Ribbon or their designee. The committee places no requirements for rewarding the ribbon, it's the quilt where the donor wants to award the ribbon. The donors will have an opportunity to select their winning quilt on Thursday afternoon at a special viewing before the show opens so their ribbon will be on display for the entire show.

The cost of a Legacy Ribbon is \$40.00. This pays for the ribbon and the listing in the Guild program. The Quilt Show Committee is limiting the number of Legacy Ribbons. There are 10 Legacy Ribbons available. It's on a first come first served basis. The deadline for Legacy Ribbons is November 1, 2018. Reservations will be accepted for Legacy Ribbons but the ribbon is not secured until payment is received.

The Quilt Show Committee is pleased and excited to offer these ribbons so people can express their love of quilts and quilting. It's a new and exciting opportunity. If you have any questions or if you would like to purchase a ribbon, please contact me at jean.fleming@sbcglobal.net.
