

This passage in the Gospel of John takes place before the resurrection. Jesus and his disciples are in Jerusalem celebrating Hanukkah. As part of this celebration, there is traditionally a reading from the Book of Numbers where Moses hears the voice of God. (Numbers 7:89) So it would have been natural for Jesus to talk about how his sheep hear his voice. In the Book of Numbers, only Moses hears the voice of God. But Jesus wants the whole world to hear his voice. His radical inclusiveness is something new. In the past, only priests and prophets normally heard the voice of God.



God is speaking to us, but we need to listen. The distractions of the world grab our attention and keep us from actively listening to God. We must find places and times of silence so we can focus on God's message to us. When are some times when I have heard my shepherd's voice? What distractions make it difficult to listen? Do I believe that Jesus calls to all of us?
