As October 1 approaches, the start of Missionary Month and the feast of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, patroness of the missions, Catholics in Canada – and all men and women of good will – are invited to (re)discover, celebrate and support missionary activity in the world, in favor of the most deprived peoples.

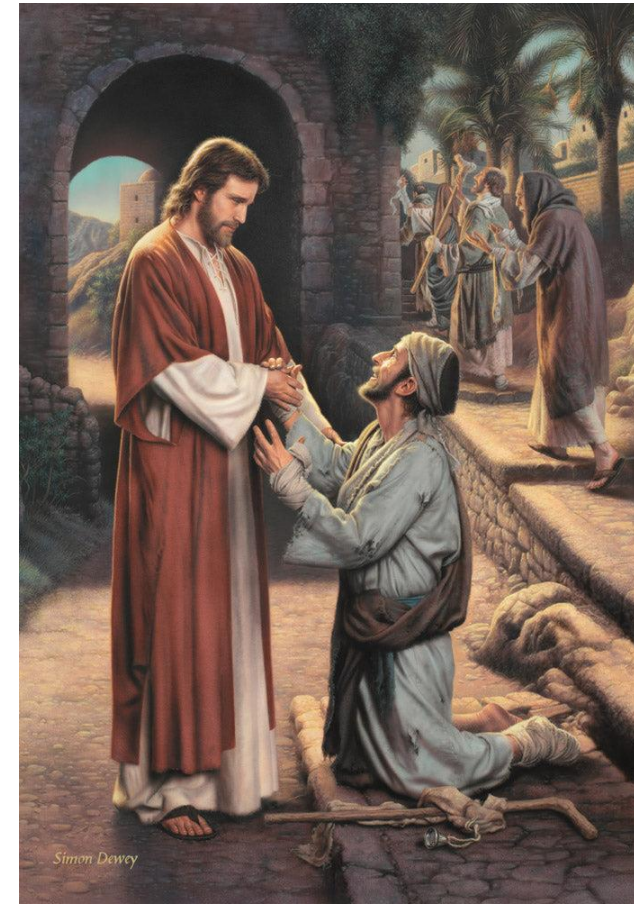
World Mission Day, the "highlight" of Missionary Month, will be celebrated next October 23 and will once again be an opportunity to support projects and initiatives in several of the 1,100 poorest dioceses in the world that depend on the

Dicastery for evangelization.

In his message published on January 6, 2022, the Pope emphasizes that the disciples of Jesus are sent by him into the world “not only to carry out the mission, but also and above all to live the mission entrusted to them; not only to bear witness, but also and above all to be witnesses of Christ”.

Thanks to the generosity of Canadians, the Sunday collection of October 24, 2021 generated more than \$2,328,800, which was distributed by Mission foï (Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith) so that the Gospel can continue to be announced to the peoples where missionary action is at its height.

Once again this year, Faith Mission calls on the generosity of Canadians to support the various projects underway around the world, as well as to continue to pray for all missionaries so that the proclamation of the Good News can continue and spread. extend to the peripheries.
