The **Justice Worker** works closely with community members and government officials in developing strategies and processes in assisting incarcerated members who have been released and may be returning to the community, and convicted offenders on probation.

Responsibilities

- Design and implement new innovative crime prevention programs for the community
- Collaborate with members in creating a healthy life plan post-release
- Research and establish appropriate community justice initiatives that are culturally inclusive
- Provide community safety and justice awareness, education, prevention, and healing
- Maintain appropriate documentation
- Maintain strict confidentiality
- Enforcing community bylaws in order to ensure a safe environment for members
- Provide alternative resources to members being released as required
- Attend court hearings as requested
- Collaborate with other departments in creating healthy activities and events
- Perform other duties as assigned
