A \$200,000 Capital Campaign To carry equine therapy Into the future

Riders who could not talk, spoke their first words. Children who could not sit up could now eat at the table with their families. Veterans who had trouble connecting built bonds. Students who had shut themselves off formed friendships. Youth who could not see past the abuse found trust. This and so much more was all achieved on horseback.

The impact of equine therapy reaches far beyond the arena and into the lives of riders and their families. For eight years Breaking Free has been serving families in the communities of Muskingum and Guernsey counties with equine therapy.

In an effort to better current program offerings to and extend services to more individuals, Breaking Free is asking you to Ride into the Future Together.

Phase 1 Property \$60,000—Donated Nine acres of property was donated to the center in 2015 as the site of their future building. The property located at 2781 N Moose Eye Road Norwich, OH will provide the center with enough land to build and grow on.

Phase 2 80x120 covered arena. This will include the land clearing, building materials, and labor.

Phase 3 Restrooms & Office, Arena Sidewalls & Doors **Phase 4** Stables
