A Note From the Pastor

A Mother Who Prayed!

Several years ago I read a quote by a prominent American who declared that he did not know of a single institution working for the betterment of humanity that was not founded by a person who had a praying mother. This is a strong statement, it may even be exaggerated, but there is certainly a relationship between the prayers of a mother and the spiritual life of her children. No greater calamity could fall upon a nation than for godly motherhood to vanish from this life.

I want us to take a look at a mother that prayed. A lady by the name of Hannah.

Hannah had a very strong desire to bring children into the world and to rear them to be the best they could be. In ancient Israel this desire was extremely strong because the Hebrews found need for earthly immortality fulfilled in their offspring. So for a woman to disappoint her husband by failing to bear children was virtually a disgrace. Hannah was fortunate, however, that her husband understood her plight and loved her in spite of her seeming inability to perform this function. But Hannah began a ritual of prayer, praying for God to give her children. So she was first of all a praying mother. There is no doubt that it was a mother much like Hannah who became the inspiration for the saying, "God could not be everywhere, so He made mothers."

Another thing about Hannah was that she prayed with Persistence. Hannah's prayer in 1 Sam. 1:1-11 was not some, "polly-want-a-cracker" type of prayer. It was asking for something of vital importance. Sometimes we fail in our prayers because we refuse to take our prayers seriously. A lot of times our prayers are too shallow and lacking in the deep fervor they need. I wonder what our prayers would be like if we absolutely knew for a fact that everything we asked was going to be answered immediately.

The workload for this position is approximately 15 hours per week. The remaining hours are divided between preparation time, church related activities, and onsite office hours in a manner determined by the Director of Music and the pastor.

Skills and Abilities Needed:


- Bachelor of Music or demonstrated ability to meet the job responsibilities through comparable work experience



...It has been 6 weeks since I requested our pastors and lay leaders to suspend public worship in an effort to slow the spread of COVID-19. I challenged all of you to find alternative ways to practice and sustain our faith. I am, and continue to be, inspired by your response and creativity!

As I expressed to you in March, I am convinced the faith community has a very important role to play in our communities during this unusual health crisis.

This week, I listened to government officials and consulted with several health professionals about phasing in a return to public worship and congregational gatherings. I confess that I do not know the single best course of action to take.

However, the most compassionate and caring approach for our return to public worship should always consider those who are most vulnerable among us.

Therefore, I have determined it is in the best interest of our churches and faith communities for public worship and congregational gatherings remain suspended through May 31.

Through this cautious and proactive action, I pray that our witness and example will save lives.

As you know, things change daily with this pandemic. I will continue to consult regularly with health experts and conference leadership concerning our date to resume public worship and gatherings.

We will one day soon be able to safely and joyfully gather! In the coming weeks, I encourage you to prepare your church for that day....

Children's Ministry

Learn, Grow, Serve, Outreach

Learning about God's love does not stop even during a time of staying at home to stay healthy! The children have been busy during this time ensuring that we have many different opportunities to learn about Easter, parables, and God's love.

On Sunday mornings, the children's ministry offers regularly scheduled Sunday School at 9:30 a.m. via ZOOM. The children are able to hear the story that they would have heard in Sunday School if we were able to meet at church. We love that some of our Sunday School teachers join us during this time to share as well. After the lesson, children's parents receive follow up files and activities to help reinforce these lessons at home.





Wednesday nights are a children's fellowship and game time. For this time, the children have had a Bible scavenger hunt (all of the items found were the colors of the Rainbow) to talk about Noah, the Ark, and faithfulness. They played Bible Trivia online to see what they were learning from our Holy Week lessons. They have also played a home-made Bible version of the *Five Second Rule* and *Cadoo*. All of these games are ways to engage the children on ZOOM and let

them share what they know about the Bible. Finding games that we can all play on ZOOM is a bit tricky, but we all have fun in the process! Next Wednesday, we will be playing Bible Charades!

During Holy Week, the children received lessons each day in email and on Facebook to help them learn about Jesus' journey during Holy Week. Each lesson included a Bible story, a devotion, a craft, and a song. These lessons helped the children succeed at Trivia!

As we look ahead, there are many questions about camp for some of our children and confirmation for others. The confirmands, parents, mentors, and I recently met on ZOOM to talk about when we may be able to proceed with confirmation. As a group, we will revisit setting a final date once we are able to return to church. We hope to be able to confirm our confirmands this summer if all goes well.

As of right now, all plans for Camp Cedar Crest are still moving as planned. However, I have reached out to the camp to ensure that things are still moving forward and to get additional information for our participating families. Once I receive that information, I will share it with our campers! Be on the lookout for information to come soon on this!
