

Trinity United Methodist Church will give at least one \$1000 scholarship this year. It is a one year scholarship. Applicants may reapply each year. An application packet may be picked up from the church office beginning March 1.

Deadline for submission of the application packet to church office is April 14, 2021.

> Applicants must:

• be a member of Trinity UMC or child of a church member OR a nonmember attending regularly and involved in church activities if the parent or legal guardian does not attend Trinity UMC

- be a graduate of an accredited high school (includes those earning GED)
- be enrolled and accepted as a full time student in a post-secondary school
 - Post secondary school includes universities, colleges, academies, seminaries, institutes of technology, vocational schools, trade schools and other career colleges that award academic degrees or professional certifications.
- submit written reference letters from one teacher/professor, one school/college counselor, one church member, and from either the pastor, college chaplain, or youth director
- submit most recent official transcript
- submit a copy of the acceptance letter
- submit the completed application packet no later than April 14
 - \circ including a typed one page essay covering
 - 1. Why you are requesting this scholarship.
 - 2. How you are planning on using the funds.
 - 3. How activities and your involvement in Trinity UMC has helped you grow in your Christian faith walk.

The recipient will be notified no later than July 1. Scholarship will be paid in two installments, \$500 prior to first semester and \$500 prior to second semester.

Trinity's Youth Ministry

The Youth Group has kicked off 2021 with a focus on small groups for deeper connections and conversations to be had whether meeting on-line or in person. Our Guys Group meets every Thursday utilizing different gaming platforms to discuss and talk through real-life situations where things don't always go our way, how some people get a little too competitive sometimes and how to interact with others in general on-line and how different that is than when you are standing right in front of them. This group is aiming to start meeting in person outside as soon as the weather warms up just a little more. We have one Girls Group who is already meeting in person (safely) where lots of hands on activities are utilized to talk about image, bullying, and what it means to be a Christian these days. They have broken plates, shaken up coke bottles and lots of other fun experiments to compare real life to Scripture in a way that often times has a relatively loud group stopping to go "wait a second". Another Girls Group meets on-line to do a more in-depth Bible Study where LOTS of tough questions are asked and LOTS of sharing about each other happens too. Our goal is to continue to work with small groups until the weather warms up and then we can safely meet altogether outside.

The College Ministry is also meeting via on-line once a week. They have just finished up a time where each person in the group led a week. It was a great experience for each student to get to put together a lesson on what God was putting on their hearts to share. We had topics ranging from mental health to favorite music selections that speak to them during the crazy time of life college brings.

Just like we know that Jesus' ministry had lots of obstacles, I am so proud of this group of young people who have continued to make Church a priority in their lives and to the families who help push and/or give rides. While we look forward to adding activities into the schedule that would be considered "normal" for youth groups, we are also thankful for all of the things that have come from this past year. There have been opportunities, conversations, and new ideas that will have a last effect on these students and their time in the youth group. I look forward to having them share all of these and themselves with the congregation at Trinity and while in ministry the greater communities.
