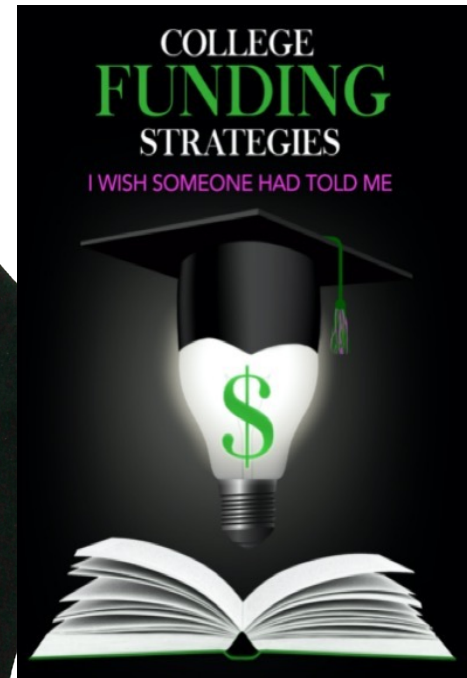
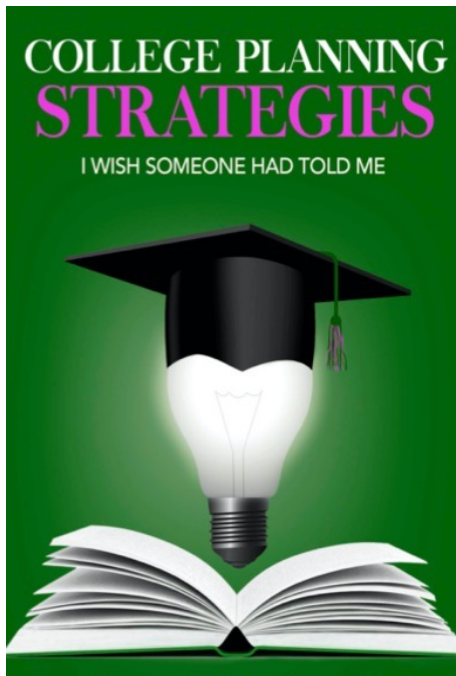

- Create/update your Scholar Profile
- Obtain letters of recommendation
- Apply to colleges and track results - Fall
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) - online (send results to top 3-5 schools) - Fall
- Search and apply for scholarships and track results
- Receive acceptance letters and financial aid awards
- Decide on a college, pay deposits and housing fees

Scholar Profile Strategies

- ❖ Assess your strengths and areas of improvement.
- ❖ Look for gaps in your scholar profile, then fill them.
- ❖ Update your scholar profile (frequently).
 - ❖ Summer break
 - ❖ Winter break
- ❖ Include the scholar profile with applications only if additional documents can be attached.

3. Choose a Major

- ❖ Narrow down and select a major before you start applying to colleges.
- ❖ Most colleges do not require students to declare a major until the end of the sophomore year.
- ❖ However, it is not recommended to wait until two years into college (sophomore year) to select a major!
- ❖ Identify your interests, values, passions, and abilities.
- ❖ Ask parents, counselors, and/or trusted advisors.
- ❖ Research careers and salaries for different majors.
- ❖ Make a list of potential majors (5 -10 colleges).



Types of Schools and Colleges

- ❖ There's about 2,000 colleges in the U.S.
- ❖ Vocational/Trade schools:
 - ❖ Teaches a skill or trade for a specific job.
 - ❖ Electrician, Auto Mechanic, HVAC Technician, Plumber, Dental Hygienist, etc.
 - ❖ Most programs are about 2 years.
 - ❖ Obtain a license, certification or certificate.
- ❖ Two-year college:
 - ❖ Community or junior college.
 - ❖ Obtain an associate's degree.
- ❖ Four-year college:
 - ❖ Undergraduate coursework.
 - ❖ Obtain a bachelor's degree.



Public vs Private Colleges

- ❖ Public college:
 - ❖ Primarily funded by a state government.
 - ❖ Generally larger than private schools.
 - ❖ In-state - students pay in-state tuition.
 - ❖ Out-of-state – students living out of state likely pay more tuition.
- ❖ Private college:
 - ❖ Often operates as an educational, non-profit organization.
 - ❖ Does not receive primary funding from a state government.
 - ❖ One tuition rate (whether in-state or out-of-state).
 - ❖ Usually more costly than public schools.

- ❖ Use an online search tool to help you research colleges:
 - ❖ <https://collegescorecard.ed.gov>
 - ❖ www.bigfuture.collegeboard.org
 - ❖ www.commonapp.org
- ❖ Take college tours (in-person and virtual tours).
- ❖ Key factors to consider with choosing a college:
 - Offers your chosen program or major
 - Cost of attendance (affordable)
 - Location (in state/out of state)
 - Public or private
 - College size (and class size)
 - A good fit for you
 - Graduation rate
 - Campus safety
 - Traditional, distance learning, or blended.

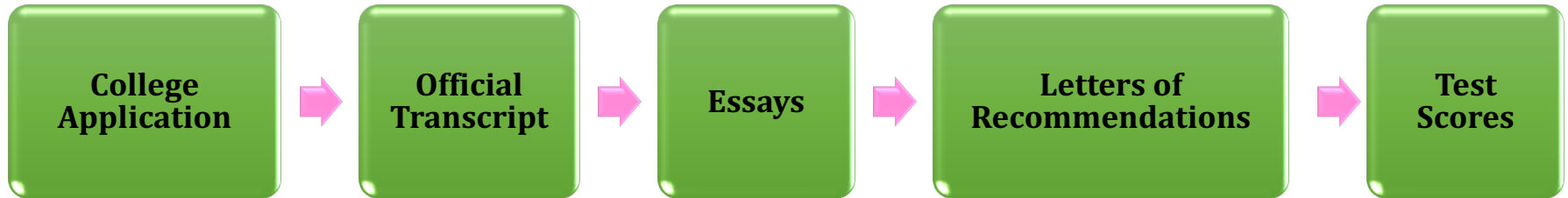

College Application Parts



- ❖ Each college has its own application process.
- ❖ Different ways to apply:
 - ❖ Electronically (create an account through a web portal)
 - ❖ By mail
- ❖ College application fee:
 - ❖ Varies for each college (\$35 - \$100)
 - ❖ Some students can get fees waived.

When to Apply to Colleges

- ❖ Apply during the FALL of your senior year (Sept - Dec).
- ❖ Early Decision (Deadline usually November 1 – 15th):
 - ❖ Can only apply to one school early decision.
 - ❖ Binding agreement you will enroll in that institution, if accepted.
 - ❖ Sends the strongest message that college is your top choice.
- ❖ Early Action (Deadline usually November 1 - 15th):
 - ❖ Apply early to as many schools as you want.
 - ❖ Does not require you to commit to the college.
 - ❖ Enables you to compare financial aid packages among several colleges and universities before accepting or declining the offer.
- ❖ Both ED and EA decisions generally made by mid December.
- ❖ National response deadline to enroll is usually May 1st.

The Common Application (App)

www.commonapp.org

- ❖ Students can submit one college applications to about 900 colleges.
- ❖ Create an account/profile and then search colleges.
- ❖ Research and apply to multiple colleges through one website portal.
- ❖ New application opens on August 1st of each year.
- ❖ Reused when applying for multiple colleges on the site.
- ❖ Applicants can use the Common App for free.
- ❖ Each college may have an application fee (varying amounts).
- ❖ Roughly 45% of participating schools do not charge an application fee.



The Common Black College Application (App)

- ❖ Students can submit one college applications to about 55 HBCUs.
- ❖ Create an account and apply to multiple colleges for about \$20.
- ❖ Select your top HBCUs to apply.
- ❖ Upload your test scores.
- ❖ Research and apply to multiple colleges through one website.
- ❖ Reused when applying for multiple colleges on the site.

Official Transcripts

- ❖ Formal copies of a student's official high school academic grades have grades from freshman to junior year.
- ❖ Know the process to request transcripts and follow it precisely.
- ❖ Parental permission may be required at your high school prior to requesting transcripts.
- ❖ Request to have official high school transcripts for all of the colleges you applied to.
- ❖ Most high schools will either mail or email your official transcripts to colleges.
- ❖ Double check with the colleges to verify receipt by the deadline, and follow-up with your high school.

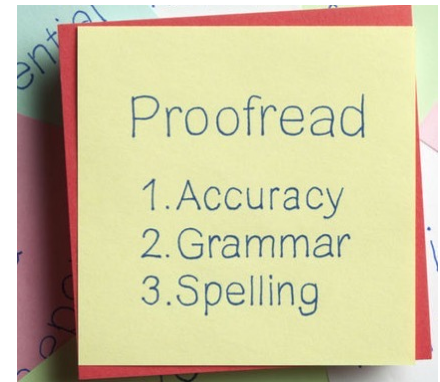

Essay Writing Guidance

- ❖ Draft essays early and prepare to revise multiple times.
- ❖ Save and re-use content for multiple applications.
- ❖ Find trusted individuals to proofread and critique your writing (i.e. teacher).
- ❖ Use free online proofreading resources (i.e. Grammarly).
- ❖ Follow directions (type, word count).
- ❖ Address the specific essay topic or question.
- ❖ Write on various topics and save them all.
- ❖ Demonstrate knowledge of college/entity (facts/statistics).
- ❖ Share how you will make a difference.



Letters of Recommendation

- ❖ Make a list of recommenders:
 - ❖ Teachers
 - ❖ School Counselors
 - ❖ Coaches
 - ❖ Community Leaders
- ❖ Provide a Scholar Profile with your recommendation request.
- ❖ Request multiple copies and ask for generic letters that can be reused.
- Provide recommenders with submission instructions.
- Set recommenders deadlines 1-2 weeks before your deadline.
- Follow-up to make sure letters are received by the deadline.
- Offer a pre-drafted letter of recommendation for them to tailor.

SAT/ACT Tests



- ❖ Take both tests (if, possible)
- ❖ Measures what students are learning in school and what they need to know to be successful in college.
- ❖ More colleges are making these test optional:
 - ❖ Essay, academics will be weighted heavier
 - ❖ May be needed for merit-based scholarships
- ❖ **ACT** has a Science Test, and one **SAT** Math Section no calculator.

Take Both Tests...Early SAT/ACT Prep

- ❖ Plan to take the tests more than once
- ❖ **Complete a SAT/ACT Prep-course (recommended)**
- ❖ **Re-take the SAT/ACT (immediately after prep-course)**
- ❖ Download mobile apps...and practice
- ❖ Retake the test (67% improve their scores)

Application Package Checklist

Follow instructions...adhere to deadlines

- Application
- Transcript (official or unofficial)
- Essay(s) or personal statement(s)
- Letter(s) of recommendation
- SAT/ACT test scores
- Financial need documents (*if applicable*)
- Scholar Profile (*optional*)

5. Navigate the Funding Process

The Cost of Attendance (COA)

- ❖ Cost of attendance is how much college will cost.
- ❖ Direct costs (paid to college):
 - ❖ Tuition and fees (price colleges charge for tuition instruction)
 - ❖ Room and board (campus housing and food)
- ❖ Indirect costs (your expenses):
 - ❖ Books, course materials, supplies
 - ❖ Personal expenses (laundry, clothes, cell phone, medical, etc.)
 - ❖ Transportation (commute, travel, etc.)
- ❖ *Go where you can afford!!*

Ways to Pay for College

Financial Aid

- ❖ Financial aid = Money to help pay for college
- ❖ Federal government awards over \$120 billion to 13 million students annually
- ❖ Types of financial aid:
 - ❖ Work study
 - ❖ Grants
 - ❖ Scholarships
 - ❖ Student Loans



Student Loans

According to the U.S. Department of Education:

- ❖ \$1.6 trillion in U.S Student Loan Debt
- ❖ 45 million borrowers
- ❖ Average student loan debt \$32,731 (in 2020)
- ❖ Avoid or minimize student loans, if possible!

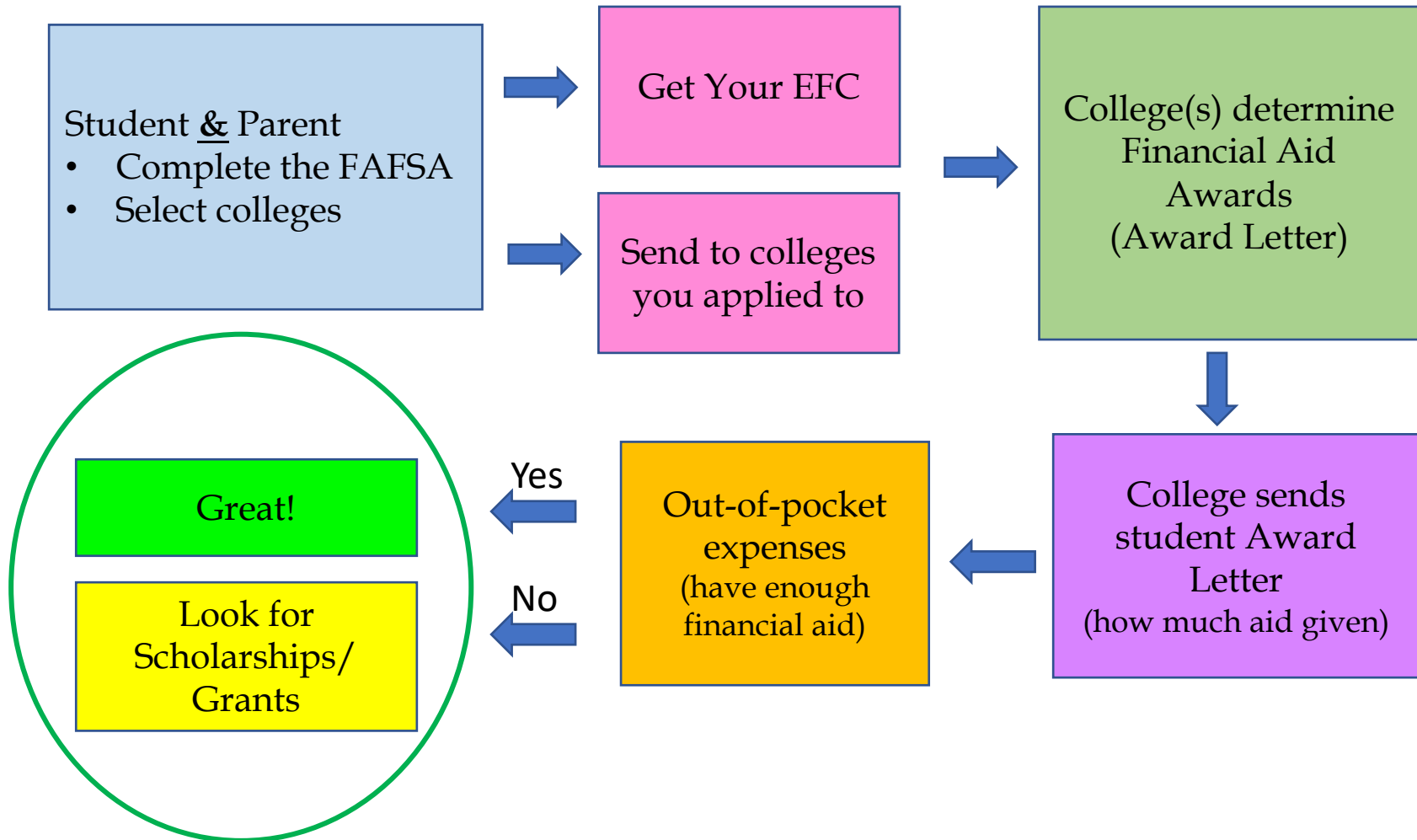
Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Apply online - <https://fafsa.ed.gov>

- ❖ FAFSA is required to receive federal financial aid.
- ❖ Used by colleges to determine student financial aid eligibility.
- ❖ Released on October 1st each academic year.
- ❖ **FREE** – no cost to apply.
- ❖ Seniors – Apply as soon as possible before the college’s deadline.
- ❖ College students - Apply every year you will return to college the following academic year. (Even if you have scholarships!)

Scholarships (Gift Aid)

- ❖ Develop a plan to search for scholarships.
- ❖ Find a scholarship mentor.
- ❖ Don't run from essays, get help proofreading and recycle responses
- ❖ Provide all requested documentation
- ❖ Track your scholarship progress

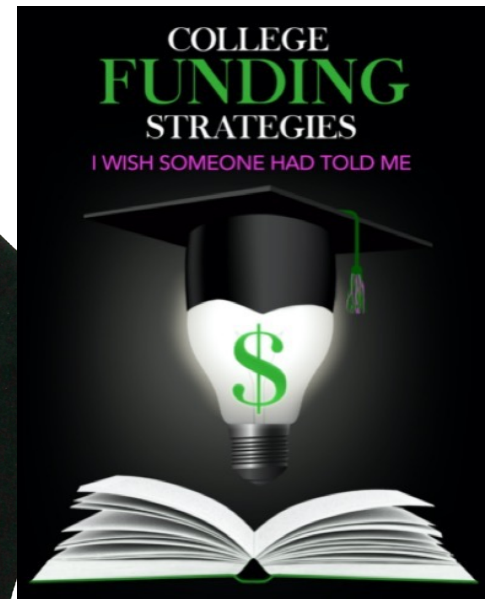
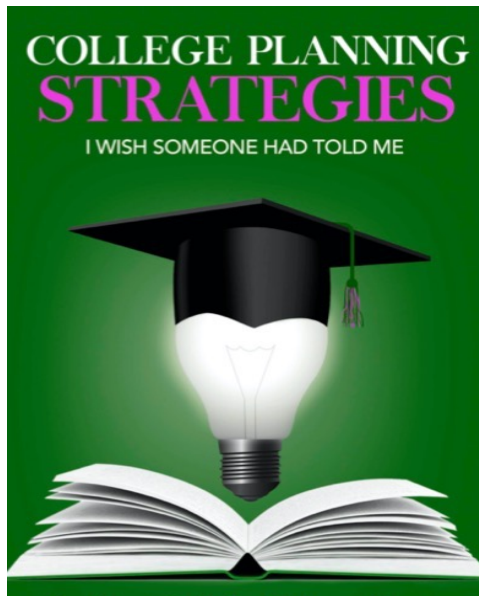
