AUDITIONS AND EVALUATIONS PROGRAM BEGINS NEXT MONTH

The first session of the Auditions and Evaluations program will be on Saturday, 28 January, 2012. The second session is Saturday, 3 March, 2012. We are pleased to have acquired the expertise of Mark Fromm, James Gourlay, and Kenneth Karsh, who will serve as our adjudicators. A registration form and detailed information will go out via email early in December, or it can be downloaded from our website: ahspittsburgh.org.

In keeping with the chapter's decision to make events accessible to more of its members, the program will be held at Perry Highway Lutheran Church, Wexford, PA. There will be ample parking for all!

The Auditions and Evaluations program started 1968, and has always consisted of two sessions, held four to six weeks apart. It is a two-part program for harp students of all ages, particularly those at the beginner and intermediate level. The goal of this program is to focus on the **improvement** the harpist makes from the first session to the next. This is not an audition in the traditional sense, or a competition. Please don't feel that your pieces

have to be "perfect" to come out and participate! You only compete with yourself at this event! The idea is to better your performance between the first and second sessions; therefore it is very important to attend both sessions. Harpists attending both sessions will receive a Certificate of Completion from the American Harp Society. In addition, they will be invited to showcase their achievements by performing in an informal recital during the "Harp Tasting" (see more below for more information).

If you are new to the chapter, you may be a little intimidated by the word "audition" in the title. The American Harp Society uses this term simply to mean "a hearing." It is NOT a try-out or a competition! The purpose of the program is for harpists to learn to become better performers. The benefit to the harpists participating in this program is incalculable. 

We continue to receive positive feedback about Jo Morrison's performance at Oakmont Presbyterian Church on November 5th.



ARE YOU READY FOR HARP TASTING?



The chapters is planning a harp tasting event for our members. Here is an excerpted from the Somerset Harp Festival website to explain more about this type of event:

"What's a Harp Tasting? It is a blind test that allows the audience to hear and compare the sounds of several harps without knowing their brand. The tasting is conducted in the concert hall behind a curtain so no one can see the harps and the same piece is played on each harp. Audience members are given evaluation sheets which they can use strictly for their own purposes. There are "no winners" at a harp tasting since every musician has different criteria by which they judge and everyone has their own likes and dislikes."
