

As you know, my father had a stroke six weeks ago. We're thankful that while his progress has not been linear, he is on the slow road to recovery. My mother, his wife of 59 years, has carried herself with such grace during this time. She says her faith in God and regular prayers are seeing her through.

When I presented her with the prayer shawl you knitted for her, it brought her to tears. It's such a beautiful gift, and it carries with it the kindness and compassion that is St. Mark's, a church she has come to love.



She regularly wraps herself in the shawl, to pray and for comfort. I've attached a photo I snapped one evening, after a long day of taking care of life without my dad. The peace on her face brings me to tears.
