FEBRUARY REFLECTION

LOVING BY SERVING

There is much anticipation in the air as we begin this year despite the sadness in the air caused by so many loved ones lives lost to this Covid-19 pandemic. The vaccination being rolled out has given us a 'life-line' and hope that we will get back to some sort of 'normalcy'.

Whatever the case, putting the past behind us and stepping boldly into the future is an exercise of hope. The past cannot be changed except in our minds. The present is fleeting and only for a moment. The future is filled with much promise, but few absolute certainties. We are able to impact the future only by what we do in the present.

With Valentine's Day just around the corner, we find ourselves looking for ways to show others that we love them. But how do we show God that we love him?

Jesus asked Peter three times "Do you love me?" Three times Peter responded, "Yes Lord, you know I love you." To each of his responses Jesus replied, "Feed my sheep." Jesus was showing Peter that an outpour of our love for Jesus is by caring for his children.

In Matthew 20: 28 Jesus said of himself that "the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life for many." One of the simplest expressions of Love in Scripture is sharing with others. One of the most valuable things we can share is ourselves: our talents and energies in serving others.

All the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to His blood

See, from His head, His hands, His feet, sorrow and love flow mingled down;

Did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown?

Were the whole realm of nature mine, that were a present far too small;

Love so amazing so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all.
