Fall Fest Saturday, October 14, 2006

Journey back in time during the Fall Fest being held at the Haldeman Mansion on Saturday, October 14.

Activities will include an ongoing cooking demonstration in the mansion's summer kitchen. Individuals in period costumes will prepare food baked in the squirrel tail oven and cook over the open hearth just as they did in the 1800s. Come and sample the delicious gingerbread, combread and other delectable food that will be baked in the oven. See how the "chicken on a string" is prepared in the fireplace that has an original mantel going back to 1740.

A Civil War Encampment will be held from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and will feature several units of Civil War re-enactors. Guests are invited to walk among the tents and see how the soldiers lived during the Civil War. Displays and demonstrations will take place throughout the day with marching, shooting of the muskets, changing of the guard, and the capture of prisoners. Wooden muskets will be available for the training of "young recruits". Numerous "civilians" in Civil War era clothing will be at the mansion and can explain how the War affected their daily lives. Children can have a hands-on experience trying their skill with toys available during that period of time.

Admission to the Civil War Encampment is free.

An art and essay contest is being held for the fourth and fifth grades at the Bainbridge Elementary School with a theme of "The Haldeman Mansion and the Civil War."


