I am Shabtika or Shab as many of you know me.

I was born in the midst of a civil war in Sri lanka. My father is a pastor; his church and our home were burnt down because of our ethnicity and Christian beliefs. My father continued to preach in Sri lanka under dangerous conditions while the rest of the family moved to India for refuge. Soon he was detained and beaten for preaching.

Consequently, all of us moved to Canada, in 1998. Eventually, I became a science teacher. Due to the poor job market, I struggled to find a teaching job. While I was considering giving up teaching, my father told me about Kingcrest, and within days I began teaching here. Fellow teachers and students were loving and encouraging. Kingcrest reminded me of all the reasons I loved teaching. I was teaching a lively group of level-1 students in January 2015 when I was deeply inspired. Many were brand new to Canada, with limited English, yet they were full of hope and confidence. Their courage was contagious and I decided to follow my passion and respond to a teaching agency from England. Soon, with their help I had multiple interviews and every single interview ended up in a job offer. I took a science teaching position in Kingston. I will be moving this August. Working at Kingcrest has been an absolute blessing; the students have taught me more than I have taught them. Thank you.
