His recovery lasted several years, during which time they lost nearly everything they had. She told of a time when an irate neighbor lambasted the husband for bringing down property values by putting vehicles and items in the front yard with a large For Sale sign. The husband, in an amazingly gracious response, reminded the neighbor that there was a time in America when such an occurrence would produce an outpouring of sympathy and offers of help.....that



neighbors would know something must be terribly wrong. (The neighbor apologized for his thoughtlessness and did ask what he could do to help.) The writer asked what would happen if we each wore a large sign around our neck with the truth about our situation: "My husband is dying," "I am so lonely I cry all the time," "I lost my job and the bank took my house," "My child has a crippling disease," "I am afraid to leave my house," "My marriage is a living nightmare."

I was wondering what my sign would say. You might be surprised. I encourage you (and me) to give grace a chance......show Christ's compassion in a world that needs it desperately, so that "all men be drawn unto Him." Condemnation and criticism do not draw people to Jesus. Love does. Let's look for those invisible signs.
