Please help with this task at home. Choosing which hand to write with is a great beginning point. Remember, all letters need to be lower case except the first one and every letter, whether big or small, begins at the top. My goal is for each student to be able to write their first name by Christmas. If your child already knows how to write their name, we will practice writing it on a line while beginning their last name. Kind: In addition to practicing the sounds we learned last week, this week we will be learning and practicing /n/, /c k/, /e/, and /h/. Please be sure to check your student's folder nightly for homework and continue reading for 10 minutes each evening. Please point out any rhyming words you may hear in your nightly reading. "Bat and cat rhyme because they both end in "-at". Knowing and identifying rhyming words helps set students up to be good readers. Good rhymers are better equipped to notice that rhyming words often have shared letter sequences, such as *-it* in *hit, sit,* and *kit*. This gives them a head start in reading. Also, congratulations to Harlo for being Hudson's student of the week! **-Mrs. Stewart**

1st/2nd: This week we will be talking about Labor Day and some of the different careers. We will continue working in first grade on letter sounds and learning correct writing strokes. Second grade has been reviewing correct letter writing. Second grade will have a spelling test on Friday, and both classes will have their first science test on Friday. I hope everyone has a great week. -Mrs. Hird

3rd/4th: I hope everyone had a nice, peaceful three-day weekend. We had a great first full week last week. Everyone is

settling into their new routine and learning the expectations of our classroom. Even though it is a short week, we will have a spelling test on Friday. Spelling lists will come home tonight. Third graders will have their first math test on Friday. Both grades will be finishing up chapter one in science and will review for the test next week. Be on the lookout for their study guides. -Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: I hope everyone enjoyed the long weekend! Our Spelling test will be on Friday this week. In Science, 5th graders will be reading about invertebrates and 6th grade will be looking at fossils. In English, both grades will review conjunctions and run-on sentences. In Reading, we will be looking at main idea and supporting details. In Social Studies, 5th grade will read about early Native Americans and 6th grade will look at MesoAmerica. Our class will also be discussing the 9/11 terrorist attacks. Don't forget to read-AR books are due Oct. 15th!

7th/8th Comm. Arts: Students have started gathering information to begin Patriot's Pen essays and will be creating outlines this week. Both grades must pass 2 AR books by Oct. 15th. -Mrs. Foster

5th/6th Math: In fifth grade, students are practicing their computation skills, practicing the naming of larger numbers both with digits and words, and looking at story problem solving. In sixth grade, students are working with missing number problems including in the context of story problems, practicing their measuring skills, and taking an early look at negative numbers. **Tests This Week:** 5th and 6th Math: Friday

7th/8th: In social studies, seventh grade is continuing to look at various civilizations of Asia. Eighth grade is continuing with ancient civilizations of the Americas. In math, seventh grade is taking an early look at the nature of angles and fractions. Eighth grade is working with complex shapes, operations with fractions, and more complex word problems. **Tests This Week:** 7th and 8th Social Studies: Friday, 8th Science: Thursday, 7th Math: Friday -Mr. Ewing

MUSIC: We have just a few short weeks until our program. Lyrics will make their way home this week. – Miss Stacie
