

I came across a series on Netflix recently as Melinda and I were searching for something to watch. It is titled Ancient Apocalypse and it is chronicled by journalist Graham Hancock as he travels the globe in search for evidence to what he believes is proof of an ancient civilization that has been lost to history. What caused this civilization to be lost, what occurred that wiped them out, is there archeological proof of their existence? As someone who enjoys history, I found this series to be very interesting, Melinda not so much as each time we tried to watch an episode she would fall asleep about half-way through. In her defense she found the show interesting but Graham has such a calm soothing voice she says that it puts her right to sleep.

At the time of writing this letter I am six episodes in and already I see a parallel to what Graham is proposing and a clear link to the biblical narrative. This really intrigues me and as I wonder how can this be used to explain the major discrepancy between the origin of humans, the age of the earth, the scientific community and the biblical timeline. I want to take the theory that this show is proposing and incorporate that with what I know of biblical studies and science.

There are ancient sites of architecture and achievement that seem out of place for the time they were built. Aka the pyramids in Egypt, those in Mexico, temples built in Turkey, mounds in the United States, and other sites that are visited in the series. How did people who were basic farmers, hunter/gathers, build these massive structures without modern equipment? Graham incorporates local legends along with what science knows of a major event that caused the oceans to rise several feet and resulted in massive flooding that changed the landscape of the earth. At each of the sites the local legends of how they came to be are very similar and these are places that are on opposite sides of the globe. In many of the stories giants came by the sea and taught the local people architecture, astronomy, and knowledge of the unknown world. Then this great flood wiped them away from history. Hmmm, that sounds a lot like what I know from the bible. There is Noah and the great flood and there is the story of the Tower of Babel in Genesis 11. This story occurs after Noah and the flood but the bible isn't as concerned with history as a detailed timeline as it is telling a story. In Babylon were the descendants of Cain, Cain who killed his brother Abel, and they wanted to be equal with God and built this giant tower. God then scatters them and starts over with the flood. There is also the Nephilim mentioned in Genesis 6:1-8, they were the offspring of fallen angels who procreated with the daughters of men and created these giants.

In the show, Graham runs into resistance from the scientific community and is called a pseudo archeologist. You may think I am crazy as well so feel free to agree or disagree with me but with so much unknown in biblical history and proof of what is mentioned in the bible actually takes place, I welcome an approach that goes beyond the classical and conventional. If you get a chance to watch this series and want to discuss your theories – I would welcome the opportunity to do so.
