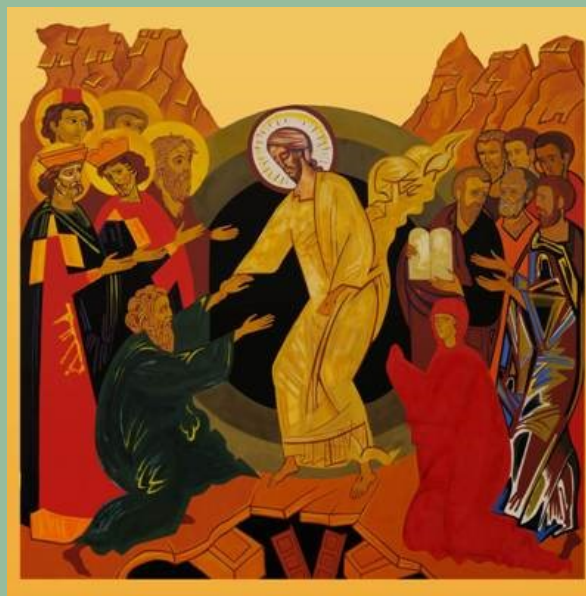

Dear brothers and sisters,

The readings of this Sunday are full of hope and tenderness from God. They call us to not forget that God is taking care of us and that He love us. However, the problem in all this is that often we do not see His love and tenderness. We spent a lot of time looking at ourselves and trying to do our best but many times on our own. How many of us have gotten frustrated with ourselves because we do not do things as we have planned, or we do not achieve what we have said we will do. On top of that, we get frustrated when circumstances do not go according to our will. Personally, I have a silly example to illustrate this. Now that I am studying, I must take Latin; I thought that it will be relatively easy being that I took Latin for a year in college. However, to my surprise, I find myself many times with no time to study and memorize certain things. The worst part is that I get frustrated with myself because I do not manage and frustrated with others and other things because they annoy me and take away my time. It is interesting this fact because the problem is not outside, but the problem is that I do not see that God is in this event of Latin and thus I reject it. By rejecting Latin, I reject the design of God for me. I said it is a silly example, but we all do this. By rejecting the cross, we reject God because we do not see God there. The Good News is that Christ has come to give sight to the blind and thus we are given the chance to see God in our life events. For this reason, I invite you all to seek time with Christ, to cry (pray) like the blind man to be able to see God's love and action in our lives.

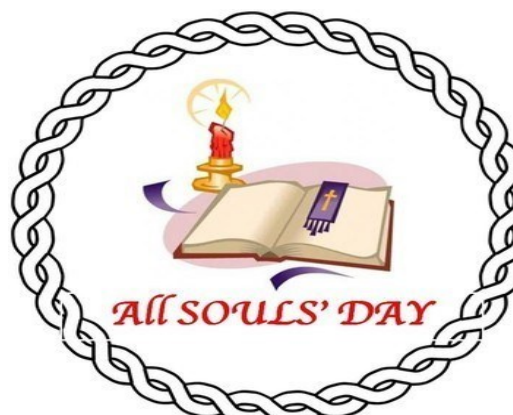
