1st/2nd: We start 4th quarter this week! Wow! Time has been flying! This week we will be talking about characters and setting in reading. We will continue discussing verbs in second grade. In first grade, we will continue discussing nouns and verbs and adding detail to our writing. We will begin a unit on goods and services in first grade social studies and both classes will begin a unit on energy in science. Both classes will have spelling and math tests on Friday. **3rd/4th:** This week in our class, we will continue to work diligently on mastering our math facts. Based on a diagnostic test that each student took in IXL, I have assigned subject matter for the students to be working on nightly. Also this week, we will have two spelling tests. One will be over our regular spelling words and the other will be over Spelling Bee words. On Wednesday, fourth grade will have a Science test over chapter 12. Third grade will have their Science test on

**5th/6th:** 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders will finish their "Ode" poems in Writing this week. In Science, 5<sup>th</sup> grade will start a new unit on stars and galaxies and 6<sup>th</sup> grade will continue reading about light and color. In Reading, students will start a new Literature Circle over the book "Wonder" and will keep working through their Buckledown workbooks. In Social Studies, 5<sup>th</sup> grade will be getting ready to test over Ch. 3. They will also have a label Central America test this Friday. 6<sup>th</sup> grade will finish a unit on Ancient Greece. Be on the lookout for a letter coming home about a "Famous Person in History" Wax Museum project. Students will present their projects on the night of the student performance in April. Please bring in pop tabs for the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter by tomorrow. **7/8 Comm. Arts:** Students will be getting some background information this week over WWI to prepare for their next Lit. 5/6 Math: The new quarter finds the fifth grade working on finding the mean, median, mode, and range of data sets, multiplication and division of fractions, and an early look at transformations. In sixth grade, students are looking at interior angle measurements, the adding and subtracting of signed numbers, and types of ratio story problems.

Tests This Week: 5th Math: Wednesday, 6th Math: Thursday

7th/8th: The new quarter finds seventh and eighth grade working on pronouns in grammar. This includes subject and object personal pronouns, antecedents, demonstrative and interrogative pronouns, etc. We will also work in the health books this week. Seventh grade is looking at the role of nutrition in our overall health, while eighth grade is learning about the connections between our health and the environment. - Mr. Ewing

MARCH CHARACTER ED: PERSEVERANCE - continued effort to do or achieve something despite difficulties, failure, or opposition.


