Mark's Thoughts

Last Sunday was All Saints Day, a day that once was celebrated greatly in churches centuries ago but passes largely unnoticed today. Part of the reason for that is a general misunderstanding of what constitutes a "saint". The Greek word for "saint" literally means "holy one" which we think of as immediately removing any human from consideration.

Yet we routinely refer to the twelve as saints, even naming congregations, St. John or St. Peter, though we certainly know they were not "holy". Further confusing the issue is some of our official church publications refer to deceased pastors as "sainted". The conclusion inevitably reached is that "saints" are dead people who were pretty good "Joes" or "Janes".

On the other hand, Oklahoma District President Henke begins many of his newsletter articles with the words "Greetings saints of Oklahoma", obviously that is not written for dead people. The Apostle Paul begins 2 Corinthians with the words, "To the church of God in Corinth, together with all the saints throughout Achaia". From 1 Corinthians we know there were some problems in Corinth so these people would hardly be considered "good". So it would appear that dead and good don't really determine sainthood.

Holy implies perfect and without sin. Since my sins have been forgiven and sent as far as the East from the West, I and you can be considered "saints" even on this side of heaven.




The Tulsa All-Lutheran Messiah will be presented for the 99th year on December 7th and 8th at Grace Lutheran in Tulsa.
