L: The Light shines in the darkness. C: and the darkness does not overcome it.

L: We gather with the saints who have gone before us and as living saints whom God calls, enlightens, and sanctifies.

C: We gather with the saints of every time and place and with saints of every race and denomination. We gather as saints young and old, happy and sad, rich and poor, and as people who hunger and thirst for God's kingdom.

L: We give you thanks for the grace you have bestowed upon your saints who have finished their life in faith and now rest from their labors. We specifically remember: Irene Banks, Duane Mallory and Dwight Scheitel

C: We trust in the hope of resurrection and the promise of new life in Christ, and know that in our grief and celebration, You are with us through it all, and we are not left alone. In the name of Christ, in whom love lives forever, we pray. Amen.

Revelation 7:9-17

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰They cried out in a loud voice, saving.

"Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!"

¹¹And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living

creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹²singing,

"Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom

and thanksgiving and honor

be to our God forever and ever! Amen."
