mission field all around us. <u>And</u> by-the-way, we didn't get rained out once!!



Rediscovering Your Joy in the Midst of Challenging Times

Normal life. Don't we miss ours? Simple things like visiting family, going out to eat, going to church, going to work or school without worry or fear. These are things that we once took for granted. Will we ever be able to return to our normal routine?

The COVID-19 (coronavirus) crisis is unprecedented in our lifetime. The fear and uncertainty of this pandemic can be crippling. That's why it is more important than ever to seek the hope found in God's Word.

To live with hope in the middle of a crisis like the coronavirus, you have to change your focus, shift your perspective, and live in light of etemity. In the Bible, Revelation 21:4 says "Then God will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and there will be no more death, and no more mourning, and no more crying, and no more pain, for the old order of things will pass away."

But this is not the end of the story!

Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 1:8-10: "We were really crushed and overwhelmed . . . and saw how powerless we were to help ourselves; but that was good, for then we put everything into the hands of God. who alone could save us . . . and he did help us" (TLB).

Trials are a fact of life, but they don't have to crush us. God will use trials to draw us closer to himself when we cooperate with him.

We all have seen these verses play out over and over in our lives as God has used painful trials to draw us closer to himself. We have discovered that real and lasting hope comes only when we focus on Christ and not our troubles. He is our ever-present, unchanging source of hope!

Part of the reason trials draw us closer to God is that he uses them to help others. So, no matter how frustrating, confusing, or scary this crisis gets, fear doesn't have the final say. 1 John 4:18 says, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear." Our hope is built on the perfect love of Jesus Christ, so we've been called to share that love with the world. Every need in the world is an OPEN DOOR to share God's love. That's why, as a church family, we should be responding to the COVID-19 (coronavirus) crisis, not by panicking or hiding out of fear, but by serving the people who are most vulnerable.

To stay joyful we should have an intimate relationship with God. It must be the central goal of your life.

How can you grow closer to Jesus during this challenging times?

First, you spend time with God. You'll never get to know God simply by talking about him. Just like any other relationship, you nourish your connection with God through spending time with him.



Second, you talk with God. Relationships require communication. You get to know God by talking and listening to him. You don't need to preach to God. You don't need to impress him with your words. You need a regular conversation with him.

Third, you trust God. Relationships are built on trust. God allows struggles in our lives so we can trust him more fully-and show us how reliable he is.

> God wants us to have joy —even in the tough times.

Let today be the beginning of a brand new start.

"Genuine faith dares to trust God in times of difficulties and does not look at circumstances, but looks solely to God." Quote from Pastor Seth Osei, Gaithersburg, Maryland

Since the coronavirus was first detected in many parts of the world in late of 2019 everyone has been uncertain of many things. Fear, loneliness and stress have become companions in homes, even Christian households. When social and spiritual interactions are derailed, not by choice but by circumstances beyond our control, we are forced to adjust. Since the lockdown that took place last March of 2020, we as a church had to adopt to the changes, like "THE NEW NORMAL" a phrase we've been hearing a lot lately.

The lockdown was the most difficult part since we as a church had to immediately find a way to let the congregation know that the church was still here to spiritually support them, even as gathering together had became impossible. We had to encourage people to find space inside their homes to worship God intimately and individually. We had to try and use any form of social media platform available that would work for most individuals and also allow us to maintain connection with our church family.

During the months of March to October, there were times that Pastor Ches had to pre-record two videos each week. One, for the midweek online bible study which aired on Wednesday nights at 7:00 pm and another one for our regular online Sunday Services which aired at 10:30 am on our media accounts. I did not realize how many hours of work it would take me to edit and produce those pre-recorded videos for our Online Services. It was only by God's grace that I was able to do it!

It was either Chelsey or Pastor Ches who did the recordings using an ipad or a cell phone. My job was to put everything together. If the videos were too dark or too bright I had to figure out how to adjust the output of the videos. I also had to mix the audio and try to eliminate the unnecessary sounds that the videos picked up during recordings. From the countdown, the welcome video, the raw video materials that I gathered from all of you (the greetings and scripture readings), I still had to add scriptures, add points/emphasis and add video clips to the sermon. Lyrics had to be added to both special numbers/solos and songs from the Praise and Worship Team. The Praise and Worship Team also did pre-recorded videos that we used for our online Sunday Services. There were nights that we went home around 11:00 pm to record 8 to 10 songs in just one night. After recording the crucial part began, "Video Cutting and Editing!"

The programs that I needed for this job sounded too complicated for me and I had to learn it fast. It also meant that during March 2020 I watched endless video tutorials for cutting and editing, with constant consultations and communications with The Lord Assembly, our home church in the Philippines asking them what programs they were using for their online services. I really did a lot of praying asking God to give me the wisdom to choose wisely and decide what will work and cater to our needs. With God's help I ended up using and combining three or more new different computer programs to be able to produce and put everything together each week for our online services that were made available for you to watch on FB, Youtube and our website.

God knows what we need before we ask (Matthew 6:8). I really praise God for giving Garry the wisdom to upgrade my computer last January 2020 before the lockdown, from Windows 7 to Windows 10. If he did not push through with the upgrading, all these edits would not be possible with my old computer because all the new programs for video editing will only work on Windows 10.

Then, when the church re-opened the first week of October we know that we as a church in these times of the COVID-19 pandemic had to cope up with the changes. We had to get used to "THE NEW NORMAL." Our church services are no longer the same as it was before the pandemic. We are now to follow strict health protocols like; limited number of people in all indoor gatherings especially in churches, social distancing at all times, sitting further apart, mandatory wearing of face masks inside the church building. And because of the potential health risks, many people will not be able to go at all. Now, we have to offer "LIVE STREAMING." meaning, new programs to learn! This time we started using OBS "Open Broadcaster Softwear." We also asked the help of Steven from the Embassy church to help and give us a crash course how they do live streaming. And the best two persons to do it for us here at Crossroads are Randy and Chelsey. As you all know we are still in the learning process and you have to bear with us.


Just recently Chelsey ordered a new switcher to make live streaming easier for Randy, the "ATEM Mini-Pro." As Paul once wrote in 2 Timothy 2:9 (NLT) while he himself was in prison and in chains, "But the word of God cannot be chained." It will be proclaimed—in different ways, perhaps. But it can't be stopped!

Prayer is what we all need right now because the Christian faith is being tested during storms. We have to pray fervently and encourage one another. In Colossians 1:17-18 (MSG), the Scripture said, "17He was there before any of it came into existence and holds it all together right up to this moment. 18 And when it comes to the church, he organizes and holds it together, like a head does a body." Besides spiritual encouragement, people also need the assurance that when they are in need, they will get help. So, in our own small way we have to try and help our church family by making special phone calls or do an act of kindness to someone that the Lord has impressed on our hearts to pray and bless them. And as Christians we have to remind one another that God is still in the business of protecting His own and we have to stay strong until the Lord's delivering power is fully exerted over this coronavirus outbreak.

2020 was a big year for personnel and not so much on the maintenance front. We started out the year carrying forward some very positive momentum and growth, but then - covid. That dreaded virus has affected every one we know on some level. When the church was initially shut down, we did immediately respond by temporarily laying off Mary Campbell as our program co-ordinator, Molly Johnson as our assistant children's and youth director, and David Birkland as our assistant facilities manager. As no one was able to foresee how long complications and restrictions due to covid would last, we are currently still operating with only four paid staff. We are incredible grateful to Mary, Molly and Dave for their service and look forward to welcoming them back as soon as we are able. Maureen has served faithfully in music ministry for Crossroads for over 25 years. Unbeknownst to many, she had tentatively started to plan to raise up and train a new director as God had given her peace in surrendering the role. Covid ultimately altered that plan and with increasing demand from other areas of her personal life, Maureen made the difficult decision to officially resign as our music ministry leader effective September 30. Words can't begin to express our gratitude for decades of your commitment, and investment in developing an incredible and talented team of worship leaders.

To those who are holding on to the ship during these challenging times. We thank you for being willing to relearn everything you thought you knew. We thank you for the hours spent on your knees in prayer when restrictions prevented you from reaching out in person. We thank you for gracefully honoring those who put so many of the restrictions in place and doing your very best to protect your flock both mentally and physically. It hasn't been perfect. There will

be those who feel they were forgotten. But you faithfully showed up each day, each week and faithfully you each have served to the very best of your abilities. For that we are eternally grateful.

We have been blessed to have Pastor Ches and Kathy lead us for more than 27 years at this point. That is a milestone that few in ministry make it to and even more rarely do they serve that length of time at one church. They have shepherded and counseled countless individuals, couples and families during their time here and we continue to be blessed, and inspired by their ministry and teaching each week. Marivic has now been our church secretary for almost twelve years and there's just no limits to the things she will learn to improve life for those she serves. She's the creative genius behind any of the signage you see posted both in the church and online and handles an impressive amount of all the technology at the church. She keeps our website and social media up to date, handles the church library and prepares each week for the worship team and all the graphics that are displayed during the service each week. Most recently we've kept her very busy learning how to edit videos for any of our pre-recorded services and learning about everything we've added to the sound room to enhance our live stream each week. Chelsey started as the church treasurer almost fourteen years ago and added children's ministries to her portfolio over ten years ago. Lastly, she added youth ministry to her portfolio four years ago. Being the treasurer has gotten increasingly complicated as the church has added multiple giving options, but our books are well in order and always up to date. Children's ministries have not met in person since March 2020, but that simply means Chelsey had to come up with a whole new way to approach children's ministries. I'll let her expand on that in her report. Since children are not meeting on Sunday mornings, she has devoted that time to learning more about our sound room and assisting in researching and purchasing the equipment we've been adding to improve our virtual experience. You'll find her setting up seating charts and greeting our congregants each week or leaning over me in the sound room to be sure she knows how to operate that system should the need arise. Senior Youth have continued meeting though covid with a mix of virtual and in-person meetings as restrictions have changed. Again, more

details can be found in that report. And Henry has risen to the challenge of keeping up with all the interior and exterior building maintenance on his own since March which has included increased sanitation duties. We are so very grateful for all his continued hard work which has allowed us to continue to serve to the extent we are able.

As far as building maintenance goes, we had planned to renovate the main office over the course of 2020. When covid began, we also immediately cut any extras in the budget so that project has been postponed. Our insurance company evaluated the premises in 2019 and sent a report outlining some items they felt needed our attention. The report was considered and a number of the smaller suggestions such as changing the electrical outlets in the children's areas were dealt with immediately. They did however highlight some larger projects. With the subsequent renewal of that policy this year, the wording changed from suggestions to demands. This year we will be re-shingling the area above the sanctuary and fixing the areas where rot has compromised our eavestroughs. We will also be repairing the concrete at the rear of the church and dealing with the graffiti. There were additional smaller items that needed attention inside the building but the most expensive projects are on the exterior. We highlight this to encourage you to consider designating your offerings to building projects, or if you are handy - we would greatly appreciate you volunteering your time to help bring these items in to compliance.

WOMEN'S MINISTRIES REPORT - 2020 Greetings Crossroads family.



Intercessory Prayer



Children's Ministries



Children's Ministries continues to encompass three groups each Sunday morning. We have a nursery for children aged newborn through three years old. Children's church is for children aged four through eight, and junior youth is for children aged nine through fourteen.

At the beginning of the year, Children's church was utilizing a curriculum called "Dig In" by Group Publishing. The series we selected was called "Epic Teachings of the Bible". We spent nine weeks studying the fruit of the spirit, finished working our way through the Lord's prayer and were close to completing the ten commandments when the church was shut down in March. The curriculum was very hands on and interactive so it was not a great fit for home use. I was beyond grateful to the publishers at David C. Cook who quickly started offering completely prepared digital family lessons at no charge to all churches (whether you were a client or not). Those lessons complete with worship videos were emailed to families each week along with extra family activities guide, activity sheets and home guide with further discussion prompts through September. At the beginning of October, that publisher rolled their content into a subscription-based program. We asked for feedback from parents and there wasn't enough participation to justify the cost so I started selecting series that had been re-formatted for use at home. These lessons included an activity, a game using supplies easily found at home, a devotion, discussion questions and a craft option. Sensing these options were still proving to be too time consuming and complicated for families, in mid November I started creating a children's church library on RightNow Media and added suggested content to it each week which I then highlighted in my weekly email. The video devotions we are utilizing are short (five minutes or less) but effective. They highlight an important section of scripture, elaborate on what it means and then provide a few questions to discuss as a family each week. Most importantly - families discuss "how do I live this out?" Covid has been quite a rollercoaster between changing restrictions and shut downs. This year it has proved next to impossible to create any sort of routine. Being a parent myself of children both in high school and elementary, I am more than familiar with the frustrations. But the longer we've been forced apart, the more driven I've become and the more comfortable I've gotten incorporating faith discussions and growth into our day to day lives. That is my desire for our families as well. Deuteronomy 6:6-7 (NIV) tells us, "these commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. 7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." God's intention is for parents to be the primary faith influencer and the church to come alongside in community. I pray that during this time apart, children have increasingly seen their parents depend on God to sustain them. That would be far more valuable to their faith development than anything I can enclose in an email.

While restrictions have made it impossible for us to resume any form of children's ministries since this first began, I do greatly miss each and every one of our church families so I have created packages that I have hand delivered approximately every six to eight weeks since March. When it became clear we weren't going to be back in the building in two weeks as we all originally thought, my first focus was of course Easter. Each family received an invite to participate virtually in "Easter Eggstravaganza". This fun package included instructions complete with fun clues and digital video clips to help parents include learning the Easter story as part of an egg hunt or made a great resource for discussion for families who don't traditionally do an egg hunt. I also included some Easter treats and crafts as part of this package. Shortly after Easter, we celebrated Mother's Day. I emailed each family some suggested interview questions and requested anyone who was willing to submit them to be part of our virtual service. I also delivered Mother's Day cards and crafts. Early in the summer, my next package was a summer fun package complete with beach bucket, water balloons, sidewalk chalk, flashlight and a summer bucket list of fun activities as well as a Father's Day craft. I did another check in with back to school which included a popcorn and movie themed treat. Each package contained some devotions to turn popular family films into some wonderful faith-based conversation starters, as well as some popcom and candy to make movie night complete. I also added a prayer calendar for September. In October, I delivered candy bags with a great resource that guided families through the process of discussing Halloween with their kids in a very non-leading manner. And to finish out the year, the church provided some incredible "Advent in a Bag" kits. These kits consisted of a beautiful full color booklet with activities to do both individually and as a family each week while exploring the meanings behind advent each week leading up to celebrating Christmas. The packages were delivered very carefully while staying fully masked and sanitizing between each stop. The feedback on the personal check-ins has been overwhelmingly positive.



Molly continued to write her own lessons each week for the junior youth specific to the youth in our congregation through the beginning of 2020. The juniors have really benefited from lessons that were designed for their stage of life and we greatly appreciate Molly's many contributions to their faith development. There was a lot of great discussion going on in that classroom on Sunday mornings. When covid struck, this group got a lot more challenging to engage. I have been sure to include treats and activities for them with the above packages but this particular group has been challenged to make their faith their own and take responsibility for their spiritual growth under the direction of their parents during our time apart. Most of these young adults are utilizing a lot of technology for their day to day learning and entertainment in this season so I've been sure to highlight some great options including a popular Bible app complete with reading plans (and digital reminders) as well as the great options available on our "RightNow" media platform. I've made myself available to talk to any of the junior youth if they would just like someone to listen, and I'm happy to provide individual recommendations of faith resources for our families upon request. I'm anxiously awaiting our return to church; however, we are short of volunteers to continue operating this class. If you are curious as to what goes on in there on Sunday, I'd be happy to fill you in. These kids would really benefit from making

Nursery has gotten a lot quieter as many of the kids who were using the room are have been promoted to and faithfully attend children's church. Prior to covid, the nursery averaged attendance of six children or less per week. Upon re-opening nursery ministry, it would still be my desire to staff two people per week in the nursery and we currently only have enough volunteers to schedule one person per week in that room. We are grateful for many of the youth in the church who happily volunteered to assist on busier days which is how we operated prior to covid. If you want to make a difference in the world, make a difference in the life of a child. Please consider volunteering in our nursery.



VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

For the first time in my years of serving at Cross-roads, we cancelled Vacation Bible School this summer due to covid restrictions. Molly and I had the privilege of attending a children's ministries conference shortly before covid and our keynote speaker was Josh Denhart. He's the author and creator of many children's ministries resources but most notably he's produced a number of science based VBS kits. Kids will have an amazing time doing some incredible

hands-on learning. I had purchased one of the VBS kits for this summer 2020 so we're excited to utilize it in 2021. If you'd like an opportunity to be involved in a fantastic outreach event, then come speak to me about the many ways you can contribute. Maybe working with kids is too overwhelming for you, but decorating or preparing crafts or shopping is what you love to do? There's lots of ways to get involved – you won't be sorry you did!



I'm a firm believer that in order to minister to the children in our congregation, we need to minister to the whole family and equip parents to led their children. No matter how dedicated you are to church attendance, the parents are the primary faith influencers in a child's life and it is our desire to partner with you as you endeavor to raise your child in the knowledge of Jesus. I understand that this may look different for each family. Books are a personal favorite resource of mine. We are blessed to have our own library here at Crossroads which I encourage you to check out. Is there a parenting resource you're interested in that we don't currently have? Please come talk to me about it. Are emailed articles more your style? What about family devotions? Family events hosted at the church? I'd love to hear what would excite you and your family. Don't forget that Crossroads also offers a service called "Right Now Media". You can access Right Now Media via your home computer or an app available for both iPhone and Android. Right Now Media offers resources on Parenting,

Bible Studies, Small Group Studies, Marriage and programming for youth and children.

In 2019, I completed Plan to Protect Training. Crossroads has an amazing small church atmosphere but our growing congregation means an increase in the children attending children's church on a regular basis. The staff and leadership of Crossroads are committed to providing a safe and secure church environment for the children entrusted to us. A draft of policy's and procedures has been prepared and presented to the church board who are in the process of reviewing the draft before voting it into official policy. Of top priority is incorporating abuse prevention training on an annual basis for all our valued volunteers. I'd also like to have a more complete picture of the kids who are regularly attending Crossroads so we can make sure all the volunteers are aware of any allergies, so we can celebrate birthdays together and for safety and security reasons. I've tried a couple of different paper and digital options but the follow through was incredibly unsuccessful. I've got a few new options for child check-in on Sunday mornings that I'm currently evaluating - more information to follow.

I want to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you to the many volunteers who work with me in children's ministries. I have an incredible team of helpers who are gifted, caring, encouraging, and faithful. There are over twenty people dedicated to serving the youngest in our congregation in a variety of roles. Your time, efforts and dedication are greatly appreciated by myself, the kids and their families.

I'd encourage you to invite the children in your life and neighborhood to come join us and please continue to pray for this program and each of the children who walk through our doors. Research continues to show that less than six percent of people accept Christ as their Lord and Savior do so after the age of twelve. It is SO important to make an impact on these children NOW. I'd love to hear any comments, feedback or suggestions you may have regarding the children's program. I'm currently available at the church on Tuesday and Thursday mornings or you can contact me on my personal phone at any time.

KidZone Update

KidZone had a steady attendance of approximately twelve kids each week, but we've had as many as twenty during our weeknight gatherings. This year we continued to utilize curriculum published by Orange that has strong digital content. The lessons themselves are presented by professional story tellers. The content allows us to incorporate games, crafts and discussion questions that tie into each lesson to make sure that kids fully understand the main point each week. We are grateful to Orange for granting our group a bursary to offset the cost of the curriculum against our poor exchange rate with our American neighbors.

When covid forced us to shut down early, our curriculum provider Orange went above and beyond to quickly assemble online links to our worship and teaching videos each week. I was able to attach our discussion questions and email those out for parents who wished to continue the fun at home. This situation did

highlight that we were missing some contact info for families who only visited the church on Wednesday evenings but fortunately most of our attendees do regularly attend Sunday services as well. We wrap up KidZone each year after the Easter break so we stopped sending out the lessons at that point. By the time September rolled around, I felt that covid fatigue had set in and as parents anxiously made a number of difficult decisions surrounding schooling, childcare and extra curricular activities - parents seemed overwhelmed and appeared to not be utilizing the midweek lessons so I chose to hold onto them. I'm anxious to return to our midweek gatherings and hope the kids are too!

KidZone is a fantastic extra curricular activity for children aged 4 through 8. We meet on Wednesday evenings from 6:45pm to 8pm. We spend time playing in the gym, we focus on one new praise and worship song each month and we have a lot of fun learning about our

heavenly father and how to apply the wisdom of the Bible to our lives. Best of all — it's free! Encourage any parents you know to pencil it on their calendars for fall 2021 and bring their children in to try it out. Please continue to keep this ministry covered in prayer. Your support and prayers are greatly appreciated. I greatly appreciate Randy Watchman and Molly Johnson's continued commitment and involvement in the beginning of 2020. I am grateful to Laurie and Norm Domoslai, as well as Kathy Jacobs and Pastor Ches for assisting as required with KidZone. Working with such fantastic leaders makes this ministry a joy to be involved with.


JR. Youth

Senior Youth has an average attendance of 10-15 youth so we've done a mixture of in person (completely masked) meetings and virtual meetings since the pandemic began. It's been a challenging year on that front as many of the youth are not allowed to attend when we do meet in person (no matter how many precautions we take), and a number of our regulars are virtually burned out after attending school online and doing all of their socialization in a digital environment and are not interested in yet another online event. We've been doing our best to support each of their choices and utilizing social media to check in regularly. Doing door drop offs of favorite treats has also been hugely successful in increasing our online participation.

The senior youth started "The Story: Student Edition" curriculum at the beginning of January 2019 and finally completed the curriculum in the fall of 2020. To borrow from the product description, "Using the clear text of the NIV, this rendering of the Bible allows its stories, poems, and teachings to come together in a single, compelling experience. The Story, Teen Edition sweeps you into the unfolding progression of Bible characters and events from Genesis to Revelation." This curriculum really helped grow the youth's comprehension of the major theme of the Bible.

We're starting a curriculum from a new publisher this month. This curriculum is a mix of topics that encourage youth to KNOW (the foundations of their faith),

GROW (become more like Jesus and grow in their faith) and GO (evangelism, sharing their faith and leading others by living out their faith).

Meeting monthly for the last two summers was quite a hit, so we tried to come up with unique ways to meet while maintaining social distancing throughout the summer. We met for an evening of mini golf and celebrated our successes (including one of the youth winning a free round on the last hole), by going out for slushes afterwards. We also hosted a cookout at Kinsmen park. The youth were all invited to our multiple drive-in events but due to social distancing rules, required their parents participation to attend so we there was not as much participation as we hoped.

Last year, myself and the youth leadership from the Alliance Church and Embassy also started meeting on a regular basis until covid began. Together we kicked off fall 2019 hosting an "Amazing Race" challenge from the Alliance Church. We planned and participated in a praise and worship evening at Embassy, and we were scheduled to host a games night here at Crossroads in March. That event unfortunately was cancelled by covid and has yet to be rescheduled. We look forward to planning some larger events when restrictions are nothing but a bad memory.

The youth still have a fundscrip account. Fundscrip allows you to order gift cards from a large selection of restaurants and local retailers. You receive the full value of the gift card, and the youth receive a percentage back as a donation. Those funds





are accumulating towards future projects and retreats. If you or anyone you know is interested in purchasing gift cards, come see me to find out how your purchase can also help support the senior youth. The youth also will also gladly accept your bottle donations. Empty bottles can be added to the recycling bins at the end of the kitchen hallway. We really appreciate your thoughtfulness and generosity.

Community Outreach

CROSSROADS FOOD PANTY is an outreach of our church in response to the identified need for an emergency supply of food with in our church family and our community. Our food pantry is motivated by our faith in Christ to serve our community by providing non-perishable food items to individuals or families in need. We make time to listen to their stories and customize their care/provisions as a practical means of offering love and hope. It has continued to grow since families in need from the community have increased as the result of economic challenges.

We usually give out one bag per family but also depending upon the number of family members per household. On a regular basis we are able to help between two to four families per month.

Update from the TREASURER



I'd like to start by offering a huge thank you to all of you for your faithfulness and obedience in giving. Your faithful giving allows us to support ministries that have a global impact for Christ as well as ministering to our local community.

I've been the treasurer for Crossroads for almost 14 years now. When I took over the position, the church was in the black financially and although we have dealt with some very big projects (repairing the roof, the LED sign and the new lighting in the sanctuary) -God has blessed our fundraising efforts and we were able to fully fund each project without incurring any debt. The church has grown and quite frankly, finances were generally pretty steady and almost predictable. Then in March, for the first time in most of our lifetimes - the church was shut down entirely. Since then, nothing (including our finances) has been anything close to predictable. Ministry leads across the globe were collectively at a loss as every church scrambled to figure out how to minister and lead their church - without the church building and without the ability to minister face to face. While giving was not the primary concern, you couldn't help but wonder - what will happen when we can't just pass the offering plate?

Thankfully over the course of the last two years, Crossroads had started adding electronic giving options. First, we added "Tithely" which is a digital platform that can be logged onto over the internet from your home computer, or you can use it via an app that is available for iPhone and Android. When you open the application or website for the first time, you'll be prompted to create an account using your contact information, as well as an email address. When you've confirmed your account, you'll be able to link a credit card to your account. From the home page, you'll search for Crossroads Pentecostal Assembly. Once you've selected our church, you'll be able to specify the amount and where you would like the funds designated. There are options available if you'd like to cover the cost of the credit card processing fees, and you also have an option to setup automated giving using your credit card. The credit card

processing fee is 2.9% + 0.30/transaction. If you choose to cover the cost of the credit card processing fees, you will also be receipted for that amount.

Then we added the option to do pre-authorized debits. This service allows donors to automate their giving through pre-authorized withdrawals from your bank account. Providing this option to our congregation was a little pricier up front, but becomes more cost effective as more people utilize it. There are forms available in the office or via email for those who are interested in automated giving. When you fill in the form, you'll select the amount you'd like to give and your withdrawal date. Crossroads recognizes the benefits of automated giving. Automated giving allows us to budget more accurately and smooths out traditional dips in finances due to the inability to attend church in person. It also allows the donor to set a giving goal and meet it without any challenges.

Finally, after covid shut the church building down – we also added the ability to accept e-mail money transfers. This has been by far our most utilized form of giving over the course of the last year. Email money transfers can be sent to: crossroad2@sasktel.net. We are registered for auto-deposit so most donors will not be required to set up a password by their bank. If you have any other questions about these services, I'd be happy to answer them for you.

Over the course of 2020, our general giving did decline by approximately 15% totalling a difference of approximately \$45,000. Knowing the devastation covid has wrought upon businesses and families alike, we are overwhelmed with gratitude at the faithfulness of God's people. There is no longer a discernable pattern in giving, but God has continually proven to be trustworthy as each month there was enough to meet our needs. The church staff and board moved quickly to ensure we realized and took advantage of any available savings. This involved laying off a number of staff members, and reducing programming budgets. The planned office renovation, as well as some building repairs recommended by our insurance company were also postponed. We were able to make use of the governments temporary wage subsidy for three months at the beginning of covid lockdown for further savings. These measures, combined with your continued generosity, allowed us to keep the remaining staff at their current salary level, keep the building in good repair, and also meant we were able to honor our commitments to the other ministries we support on a regular basis. We did finish the year showing a loss of just under \$5000.

YOUR GENEROSITYIS MAKING A DIFFERENCE

However, we did replace the sound room computer in January 2020, and thanks to your additional contributions we also purchased two new cameras and a switcher to improve our ability to live stream services. We count ourselves truly blessed to have some money in the bank which means we were able to continue operating without incurring any debt. As Randy mentioned in the maintenance report, we do have some upcoming building repairs that the insurance company has now given us a due date to complete in this calendar year. We trust that God will continue to meet our need and look forward to completing those projects this year.

A friendly reminder that even when utilizing electronic giving options, designating your funds is available and encouraged and we are diligent in sending your funds where you request they be sent. The general designation is to be used for your general tithing and offerings. Other designations include missions, building projects, women's ministries, King's Kids, or youth. We are also able to forward funds to Teen Challenge, Horizon College & Seminary, Living Waters Camp, ERDO, Watoto Children's Choir, Yorkton Dream Centre and our local Christian radio channel. In Tithely, there is a drop-down menu available to designate your offerings. The default selection is set to "tithe". You can select designations when initially setting up your pre-authorized debits, and you can designate funds when e-transferring by utilizing the memo field. Undesignated funds are added to the general fund.

I'm at the church on Tuesday and Thursday mornings and I am more than happy to answer any questions you may have on my personal phone number as well. It's a pleasure being involved in our church team and may God bless each of you.
