In June, 2016 I was diagnosed with a very rare category of "VASULITIS. However, once I was advised of the particulars of my condition, and the doctors could not figure out how I developed such a massive amount of inflammation in my entire bloodstream, mid and large arteries; and is considered one of the rarest cases on record. When you are as healthy as I was, and at 72 did not take any drugs or medication, I instinctively knew exactly when and how the condition developed from germs that got into an open wound due to the negligence and medical malpractice of Dr. Kopelman, Dermatologist at the Reston Medical Center, but as you will see in Attorney Jamaal Whaten Thomas's correspondence denying my Claim to Settle my case out-of-court, he went as far as to insult my integrity, and made light of the horrifying ordeal that I am suffer and not only defended Dr. Kopelman's negligence, confirmed it as the standard by which Kaiser uses as its standard for health care. Which for me at 74 is nothing less than *ELDER ABUSE*; and to insult me even further, Kaiser's Attorney, Jamaal Whaten Thomas, Esq. Principal Claims Examiner actually praised Dr. Kopelman's standards as professional and compassionate. But you will have an opportunity to evaluate the preponderance of the evidence for yourself

However, because the Radiologist that transcribed my Pet-Scan images said he had NEVER seen inflammation in a person's entire bloodstream, mid and large arteries that appeared in dimension to be the size and width of a computer cable vs. a thin wire visual, after researching "Vasculitis" and discovered the possibility developing GCA and going blind. Or, having a stroke, heart attack or just dropping dead, I discovered that the only two medical facilities in the country that had a Center for Vasculitis treatment were the Mayo Clinic and Johns Hopkins, and **Kaiser denied me a referral to Johns Hopkins Center for Vasculitis**. Therefore, so I would at least be in an environment that was familiar with rare diseases, and also had an ongoing "Vasculitis study" that was in progress, I surmised since the likelihood of my going blind or dropping dead without warning was so high, I volunteered to take part in a "Vasculitis" study at the National Institute of Health [NIH] so I would at least be in an environment that was familiar with Vasculitis, and also leave a legacy of being a part of the success of study that is testing a drug that will replace Prednisone and ultimately benefit millions.
