## A. Sacred Cows (vv. 1-7)

- 1. Pharaoh's Enemy (v. 1): why might Pharaoh not know who is against him?
  - a. <u>Application</u>: why is God a much more dreadful enemy than Satan?
  - b. **Application**: how can God's anger be appeased so that He is no longer an enemy?

#### 2. Gracious Warning (vv. 1-5)

- a. Severity: by what measure will the plagues increase in severity?
- b. How does this plague target the gods of Egypt gods and assault the worship of Egypt?
- c. **Application**: What comfort is offered to God's people here?

#### 3. God's Word Vindicated (vv. 6-7)

- a. What is the dispute regarding which livestock die?
  - 1) What can all mean?
  - 2) Which animals were particularly targeted by the plague (cf. v. 3)

b. How is Pharaoh a "classic skeptic"?

### B. Unholy Sores (vv. 8-12)

- **1.** <u>Justice (vv. 8-9)</u>
  - **a.** Why does God tell Moses to perform the signact in the sight of Pharaoh?
  - **b.** What is significant about the source of the soot?

## **2.** Disgrace (vv. 10-11)

- a. What distinction does God make here?
- **b.** In what sense can the magicians not *stand* before Moses, and how is that fitting?
- **c.** Why was being covered in boils (or other physical impurity) a grave problem for the Egyptian elites?
- **d.** <u>Application</u>: how does the God of the Hebrews beautifully contrast with the gods of Egypt in this area particularly?
- 3. God's Word Vindicated (v. 12):
  - a. How is God's freedom and sovereignty displayed here?
  - b. Even though God hardens Pharaoh's heart, is Pharaoh doing anything against his will?
