1st/2nd: After a long weekend, 1st and 2nd grades are going to continue working hard on their handwriting skills, reading and math facts. It is extremely important to be practicing those math facts at home too. We will also be reading a book in class titled *The Brave Bunny*. Students will be completing their DIBELS reading test this week as well, so make sure they're getting plenty of rest. Finally, just a friendly reminder, students need to be reading their books so they can take their AR tests. I hope you all have a great week! -Mrs. Hird

3rd/4th: Third and fourth graders have been very busy learning new things. We are learning about the different kinds of sentences and what punctuation to use with each one. In math we are learning about elapsed time and how to solve problems with missing addends. **-Mrs. Cooper**

5th/6th: I hope everyone had a wonderful weekend! 5th and 6th graders will continue working on "Ideas" in 6-Trait Writing this week. In Science, both grades will be reading about the planets and will also work on their solar system models. In English, students will be reviewing simple subjects and predicates. In Reading, students will practice finding the main idea and supporting details in an article. In Social Studies, 5th graders will have a MO symbols test on Friday and 6th grade will be getting ready to test next week over the Civil War. 7th and 8th graders have been reading about plot, conflict, and character in Comm. Arts. They were able to compare two of their stories to episodes of "The Twilight Zone" last week and enjoyed seeing the similarities and differences between the story and the show. Don't forget-1st Quarter AR Book Requirements are due Mon. Oct. 12th. To finish on time, students need to pass their first AR test as soon as possible this week. **-Mrs. Foster**

7th/8th: 5th-8th Math: As we are taking a short portion of the beginning of the year trying to make up some time that we unfortunately lost, it is a good time to stress the importance of having proficiency on those basic facts for addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. They are so important as the building blocks of everything we do in math. Also, quick recall will be a real timesaver when working on daily assignments and tests, which is something I'm sure we can all get behind.

7th-8th: In grammar, students are working on different types of sentences and sentence structure in order to pick out subjects and verbs. We will soon be discussing specific parts of speech, including verbs. In science, 7th grade is looking at how electron arrangement in atoms affect how they react with other elements. Eighth grade is learning about electricity and circuits and learning some of the types of calculations involved with electricity.
