Why Capitular Masonry?

Many masons do not know why the Chapter of Royal Arch Masons was started or why it is a needed part of the Master Mason's natural completion of their degree search.

The Holy Royal Arch used to be conferred within the blue lodges. This is because it was deemed important to the Master Mason to receive this important degree as the completion of their degree study within the blue lodge. Before the Holy Royal Arch degree could be conferred upon a mason, he

must first have passed the chair. This meant he had to be a past master of a blue lodge. This created an issue with the conferral of this important degree because not everyone was a past master. This created the necessity for a past master degree, even if it only honorary or virtual. Thus the beginning of the Past Master degree as started. It was conferred originally on brother Master Masons who desired to advance to the degree of the Holy Royal Arch. The first conferral of the Past Master degree was in England around 1768.

Now that the brother was a Past Master, even if only virtual, they could received the degree of the Holy Royal Arch. Research reveals the degree was first conferred in Ireland in the late 17th century. Another instance was recorded in England in 1738. There was evidence of the degree being conferred through the British Military Lodges as early as 1752. These traveling or occasional lodges were responsible for bringing the degree, along with the Mark Master degree, to the new world. The first such conferral in the new world, or North America, was in Fredericksburg Lodge No. 4, in Fredericksburg, Virginia, on December 12, 1753. This is interesting because Brother George Washington was raised a Master Mason in that lodge only a few months earlier.

Receiving the True Word of a Master Mason should be the goal of every mason. Invite your Brothers to join the York Rite. The light they receive will continue their search for more education and more light as they continue their masonic journey.

We hear a lot about the Super Excellent Master Degree, yet it is rarely exemplified. So just what is this degree all about? As has been stated before, the degree of Super Excellent Master is not a degree of the Crypt. But, it relates events that lead to the recovery of the lost Word. This degree beautifully tells of a period in history in which all Freemasons are interested, that period following the destruction of the First Temple. The essence of the degree is foretold in the presentation by the Principal Sojourner in the Royal Arch Degree when he makes the following reference: "Zedekiah was one and twenty years old when he began to reign and he reigned for eleven years in Jerusalem, and he did which was evil in the sight of the Lord his God," etc.

The degree of Super Excellent Master is one of the best devised, most impressive, and beautiful degrees. It is most enlightening and relevant to one's daily life. In a display of exciting events, Biblical characters come to life exemplifying this historic event. Here Nebuchadnezzar rules again, Zedekiah proves the results of his wicked life, and Ezekiel and Jeremiah prophesize the promises of Almighty God.

It is a beautiful and meaningful degree. It takes many Cryptic Masons to confer the degree because there are many parts. The next time the degree is offered, make it a point to travel and witness it. You will not regret the time you spent getting there to see it.

Why the Sword and the Trowel?

The sword and the trowel are important symbols and implements used in Masonry in general and specifically in Cryptic Masonry. The sword is



an implement of protection and sometimes violence. The sword reminds us of he Tiler who protects the door to the Lodge during meetings. We see it mentioned as well in Old Testament scripture. We read in Nehemiah 4:15-18, "When our enemies heard that we knew their scheme and that God had frustrated it, every one of us returned to his own

work on the wall. ¹⁶ From that day on, half of my men did the work while the other half held spears, shields, bows, and armor. The officers supported all the people of Judah, ¹⁷ who were rebuilding the wall. The laborers who carried the loads worked with one hand and held a weapon with the other. ¹⁸ Each of the builders had his sword strapped around his waist while he was building, and the trumpeter was beside me." It was therefore necessary to have the sword present when the workmen were building the walls of Jerusalem to secure protection of themselves from their enemies.

In the Lodge, the trowel is an implement used to spread the cement which is used in constructing the building. It is symbolically used to bring the Brethren together in harmony and brotherly love. The scripture quoted earlier from Nehemiah does not specifically mention the trowel as being used in building the walls of Jerusalem, however we know it was the implement used by the operative stone masons who were employed in the construction. Nehemiah used workmen who were not only skilled in construction, but skilled in warfare as well. This was necessary to protect the walls of Jerusalem during the construction and those who were working on the building. The trowel can be viewed as a symbol of completion as well. This includes the building upon which it is used. It also can be viewed as being used to build our own spiritual buildings and temples.

Combine this with the Perfect Ashlar from the Lodge, and we see how the three can come together spiritually for each of us. The sword is used to protect ourselves spiritually from the enemy who would seek to bring us down. The trowel reminds us to

continue to work to complete our spiritual temple in all of our actions. The Perfect Ashlar reminds us we need to strive to hone our own stones from the Rough Ashlar to prepare it for the completion of our spiritual temple. All of these work together to remind us to constantly seek



to make ourselves better as men and Masons as we travel through this imperfect world.
