What a fun year we had in 2016! We attended many Reds games, a Bearcat game, an FCCincinnati match, a Dayton Dragons game and a Cyclones game! Please learn more about the progress we've made and the difference we made in kids' lives!

Our Mission:

Sports Games for Kids is a 501(c)3 charity focused on bringing the joy of professional and collegiate level sports to children facing hardships in their young lives. We aim to give a lasting special memory to children from foster care programs, children's hospitals and homeless shelters. By providing an all expenses paid trip to games in our service area, the kids are able to experience a sense of normalcy and fun, without the financial burden of such an event. The kids and their chaperones are provided with a free in-game meal, snacks, drinks and a souvenir t-shirt to remember the day by. They are led in cheers and are taught about the game by the Cincy Super Fan. Additional fun is planned according to the individual events (including: posters, costumes, pre-game fan parades and even player autographs). According to Teammarketing.com, it costs upwards of \$250 for a family of 4 to attend a Baseball game in Cincinnati (including tickets, parking, food and drinks and a souvenir hat). Many families, especially those paying heavy

medical bills, those living in impoverished conditions, or foster parents who care for multiple children, could not afford such an event. By providing our services to these families, the kids are able to have that special memory of the first time they entered the stadium to see their home team play.

Our board consists entirely of volunteers, so that there are no administration costs associated with our charity. We work tirelessly to find ways of saving money on events so that every dollar raised goes further to helping bring this joy to as many children as possible. Fundraisers are held at little to no cost by finding local businesses, sponsors and outside groups which share our values who hold these fundraisers on our behalf, or that host the events free of charge to us. It is our firm belief that every effort should be made to keep donations focused on the programs we provide. Congratulations to Queen City Firm's team on winning the first annual CST Footgolf Tournament! Our fundraisers weren't our only source of Revenue. So where are these funds going? Over 99% of Sports Games for Kid's expenses have been spent directly on the children. These funds purchase snacks, water, hotdogs, shirts, tickets and other fun game-

day items. On average, we spent approximately \$15.00 on every child that we take to a game. This is a drastic reduction in "Cost per Person" from our work in 2015, which was

closer to \$23.00. We were able to accomplish this by constantly searching for the best deals we could. For instance, our partnership with 513 Shirts has reduced the price per shirt by \$2 and our

partnership with Signature furniture provided us with 100 free tickets to reds games! Since every member of Sports Games for Kids works strictly as a volunteer, no one has ever been paid for their work for Sports Games for Kids, and our current Payroll is \$0.00. Regrettably, we can't raise these funds out of thin air! In order to accept online payments and credit card donations, we utilize PayPal's services, which incur a 2.9% fee on all donations made through this channel. We are also proud to announce that in 2016 not a single dollar was spent on fundraising! By partnering with local businesses and groups who share our passion, fundraisers were held without cost or funded entirely by outside organizations on our behalf. We have grown dramatically in 2016, not only in our partnerships and impact, but also in our knowledge and experience and we plan to continue this growth for many years to come!
