Standard Number

Assessment

The School Nurse:

- Systematically compares and contrasts clinical findings.
- Involves the client, family, school staff, and stakeholders in holistic data collection.
- Uses appropriate evidence-based assessment techniques and instruments in collecting data.
- Documents relevant data in a retrievable form.

STANDARD N U M B E R

Diagnosis

- The School Nurse:
- Derives nursing diagnoses or issues based on assessment data.
- Documents nursing diagnoses or issues in a manner that facilitates the determination of the expected outcomes and plan.

STANDARD NUMBER

Outcomes Identification

The School Nurse:

- Involves the client, family, school staff, and other healthcare providers in formulating expected outcomes.
- Modifies expected outcomes based on changes in the status of the client or evaluation data.
- Documents expected outcomes as measurable goals.



Planning

The School Nurse:

- Develops an individual healthcare plan considering the client characteristics or the situation with appropriate strategies for health promotion and disease prevention.
- Utilizes the plan to provide direction to other members of the school team.



Implementation

The School Nurse:

- Implements the plan in a safe and timely manner.
- Documents implementation and any modifications, including changes and omissions, of the specified plan.
- Collaborates with nursing colleagues and others to implement the plan.

Categories include Coordination of Care, Health Teaching and Promotion, Consultation and Prescriptive Authority and Treatment



Evaluation

The School Nurse:

- Evaluates the effectiveness of the planned strategies in relation to client responses and attainment of expected outcomes
- Documents the results of the evaluation
