Our Parish Family

Are you cordial, charitable, or actually committed in your relations to others in our Parish Family? Cordial = respectful; charitable= doing good because it's “what’s right”; committed means really welcoming and warmly outreaching to another person here. We are a family, after all. We need to go from maintenance to Mission! Are we growing or slowing? Are you really outreaching to others or just coming for worship and “doing the basics”? If we are going to continue as a Parish Family we need to be committed to one another as a family and community...

We have received results of **the Archdiocesan Survey, “Be Missionary Disciples”**- we will be forming a study group soon to analyze the data of how we as a parish are growing in Christ, evangelizing and building a Family of Faith. We will alert you of the Survey results and then plan for a Parish Discussion on these results.

Acts 9:36-43

Peter heals Tabitha, who “was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity.” The early Catholic Church, and namely Apostles, empowered by Christ’s Resurrection and Holy Spirit, heals and restores to life. *How can you?* *Apostle* means *to be sent*: Are you sent on a Mission or just “along for the ride”? Thus, we need to be, first, connected to the Risen Lord Jesus Christ and, second, empowered by Him, be ready and willing to help heal and fulfill the Mission like the First apostles: Don’t leave it up to someone else” (whoever that is)!

Revelation 7:9-17

7:9 After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. 7:10 They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" 7:11 And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God... How well do you really worship God? Salvation means “healing”: What do you need healing from/of? And those named above went thru an “ordeal”= suffering: Are you avoiding suffering or entering into it for Jesus Christ Who did for you?

John 10:22-30=”The Good Shepherd”

Jesus answered, "I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; 10:26 but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep.10:27 My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me.”...Do you spend time listening to Jesus in prayer/meditation? Are you obeying His Voice-His commands—to Love Him and the Trinity More? To do, good deeds in action? Obey means “to listen”—are you? And are you following thru? **Be Missionary Disciples**, Archbishop Lori’s Pastoral Letter, which forms the crux of our Program of evaluation of our Parish Family and evangelizing, proposes we must first have a personal relationship with the Living Lord (and not just “lip synching” by “attending Mass” and bolting out) and then carry thru with welcoming others (not just saying “Hi” and that’s it-never getting to know them) and genuinely forming a Faith Family here at St Peter and St Patrick’s. What are you doing to foster your devotion to Christ and His Church? How are you participating in our Parish Family—in social, spiritual and service opportunities? While we are doing a “good job” at this we need to “ramp it up” by helping our Family grow! Perhaps you have not been asked to help or have been ignored or have a suggestion –please let us know so we can grow! I propose the ABC’s of Parish Faith-Family Formation as follows: A= Aliveness in Christ= you actually are living a real, conscious life in Jesus Christ: R U? B=Bonding with others—especially those we don’t know—and actually forming a living Family of Faith. C=Catechesis= Faith formation—which means *knowing* your faith to *show* our faith to others. This is known as apologetics=reasonable explanations of our Faith explained to others.
