+ **New Clarifications regarding COVID-19 Prevention Measures:**

New provincial restrictions came into effect on October 26.

Funerals, prayer vigils for the deceased, weddings and baptisms are limited to 150 people or 50 % of capacity, whichever is lower. No proof of vaccination is required.

Furthermore, the Archdiocese is issuing new instructions on parish meetings, conferences, assemblies, etc. As of today, these meetings may be held with more than 25 people present if proof of vaccination is asked of in-person participants.



Bishop LeGatt Video Message COVID-Related Measures and Seeing Christ in All

In this video containing a two-fold message, Archbishop LeGatt's takes a moment to discuss the rationale behind the newest set of COVID-related restrictions in place throughout our Archdiocese, to then reflect on the division

that may be becoming more and more pronounced and urgent in our families, parishes, communities, and society. Issues surrounding mask-wearing and vaccination have become so emotionally charged and sensitive that they have the potential to do unimaginable and long-lasting harm to our families and communities, leading to anger, and even sometimes to hate. Hence, we must, before anything, love. Love conquers all. Although we may have strong convictions on one side of these issues or the other, let us never forget the person, first: the presence of Christ in each and all, He, who calls us first to love each and all. Let us not become so consumed by our positions that we forget the value and the dignity of all, and see the person first, in God's image.
