
July 2022

Early July greetings, and hope you all have a safe and fun-filled 4th of July celebration this year! I've just returned from a week of vacation in western North Carolina, where my wife and I can really relax! We spent a great deal of time in the Pisgah National Forest searching for waterfalls, and we found some spectacular ones which promotes a deep relaxation which grows into a spiritual experience with, our amazing Trinity - The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I confess that I seek out these spiritual experiences to help me grow in my faith. After all these years as a follower of Jesus, I am still learning what it means to grow in Christ. Dallas Willard, a well-known Christian theologian describes "growing in Christ" as a "golden triangle of spiritual transformation." By embracing our situation, and opening our lives to the guidance of the Spirit and practicing spiritual discipline, we can continually "take off the old human-nature, and put on the new nature", of a life well-lived in the likeness and integrity of Christ. All 3 parts of our amazing Trinity are essential to this process of our transformation. In regards to the Father, we are asked to embrace our situation through God the Father -Through the hard-knocks of life, God can challenge our self-sufficiency and stretch our ability to empathize with the suffering of others. When we blame other people for our problems, trials, or troubles we are not embracing the situation, as we show our spiritual immaturity. Jesus could have grumbled that life was unfair to him, or complained that sinful people were unworthy of him, or asked God for a loftier, less humiliating assignment. Paul reminds us that Jesus emptied himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. And James reminds us, "Think of the various tests you encounter as occasions for joy – after all, you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance, and let this endurance complete its work so that you may be fully mature, complete, and lacking in nothing!" The second side of our Trinity, we open our lives to the guidance of the Spirit. Jesus knew that we needed a helper who had helped him. At his Baptism, the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus like a dove, and when launching his ministry, Jesus acknowledged the Spirit as the source of the courage and guidance he would daily need to respond in God-like ways to the challenges he encountered. The third part of our Trinity reminds us to practice spiritual discipline to imitate our Lord, Jesus Christ - share his life, and make ourselves available to Jesus for the transformation of our hearts and minds. To loosen the bonds of selfishness – to open our hearts to the big-heartedness of Jesus Christ – serve our neighbors in need – open our clenched-fists to become the hands and feet of Christ, and join Jesus in the work of mending this big world that God loves. It's a successful day when we practice these spiritual disciplines so to "Put on our Lord Jesus Christ", and be guided by the Spirit to grow in Christ's likeness. Enjoy your summer as you grow in spirituality, and we can't wait to see you all real soon at one of our worship services! May God continue to bless and keep you! Grace and Peace! Pastor Tom

Rev. Keith Jones Malachi 3:1-4 English Standard Version

3 "Behold, I send my messenger, and he will prepare the way before me. And the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple; and the messenger of the covenant in whom you delight, behold, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. 2 But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap. 3 He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, and they will bring offerings in righteousness to the Lord. 4 Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

I've seen a few reports about the Queen's jubilee in England. Lots of ceremonial celebrations. I always imagine what it would be like if someone showed up before the dirtiest person in England and said they were to be presented before the Queen. So much effort would go into cleaning up that person, making them presentable. It's no small feat, but that's what must be done so they can be presented, due to the gulf existing between the height of royalty and someone covered in filth.

I've been thinking a lot lately about the presence of God. We long for it, and yet at the core, it's so different than we are. We are sinful and broken, and God is purity and perfection. Emotionally, we bounce all over the place, and often find ourselves in conflict, and yet God is pure love, consistent faithfulness. We are unworthy of God's love, and such efforts must be made to make us worthy. When we talk about a refiner's fire, we're talking about putting precious metals in the hottest part of the fire to burn out impurities. The precious metals look great when they're out of the fire, and we all love to see glass when it's blown artistically, but none of us would joyfully welcome being placed into the midst of a blazing furnace or a refiner's fire -- the heat would be so intense, we fear getting destroyed.

And so what a gift it is that Jesus Christ willingly steps into the depths of the furnace, into the central core of the refiner's fire, and bears all the heat, so that we don't have to. How amazing is that -- we could have been consumed, but Christ endures that so that we don't have to. Christ makes us worthy by accepting the heat of the flames, and we receive the reward he deserves, and it's given as a gift.....

How incredible is that??? We are converted from the depths of unworthiness to the heights of heaven, made worthy to sit before God in all of God's perfection....

It's simply amazing...

(cont from page 6) Adding a few drops of **bleach to your water** before adding your bouquet of flowers will actually prevent mildew and your bouquet will last longer. Use **tension rods** to organize cutting boards and sheet pans. No more lifting a heavy stack of pans to get what you need out of the bottom. Use a **curtain rod** to hang up your pots and pans. Avoid **tan-gled necklaces** while traveling by threading your chain through a plastic drinking straw. Lose a **screw in your glasses**? Just slip in an stud earring and secure it with the back. Don't have a **funnel**! Use an envelope: Cut one end of the envelope off making a large triangle then snip off a piece from the corner. Use **dish soap for an ice pack**. Fill a small ziploc bag with plain dish soap. It won't freeze solid, contour it to your body. Double up the bag to protect for leaks.
