Round #2: Children (or Easier)

2 Points:

Jesus died on this killing device, made of the wood of two trees tied and nailed together.

A: What is a cross?

4 Points:

Jesus' body was given to a man who chose to bury him in his own grave, which was not in the ground, but rather, here.

A: What is a cave?

6 Points:

When Jesus was arrested he had to perform healing on a servant. He healed this part of the servant's body because one of the disciples panicked and stabbed him.

A: What is an ear?

8 points:

The Last Supper was actually held on this night of the week.

A: What is Thursday?

10 Points:

On the cross, Jesus said "Behold, your mother," to this disciple, meaning that the disciple should take care of Mary.

A: Who is John?



Round #1: Adults (or harder)

2 points:

Shortly after Jesus' birth, a multitude of angels was seen by this group of people.

A: What are shepherds?

4 points:

This province, containing both the town of Nazareth and a sea by the same name, is where Jesus was raised after returning from Egypt.

A: What is Galilee?

6 points:

The disciples first started speaking in tongues on this holiday.

A: What is Pentecost?

8 points:

This cup, used at the Last Supper, is a missing artifact that has been sought by treasure hunters from around the world.

A: What is the Holy Grail?

10 points:

When Jesus arose on Easter Sunday, an angel completed a feat that would have taken too much strength for any one man.

A: What is rolling the stone away?



Round #2: Adults (or harder)

2 points:

An angel announced the birth of Jesus to his mother Mary shortly after this woman was also told she was pregnant John the Baptist.

A: Who is Elizabeth?

4 points:

The holiday marking the Last Supper and Jesus' arrest is commonly known as this day.

A: What is Maundy Thursday?

6 points:

At Pentecost, when people visiting Jerusalem heard the disciples speaking in strange languages and glorifying God, they accused the disciples of this indiscretion.

A: What is drunkenness?

8 points:

This Jewish Holiday commemorates the last plague placed upon Egypt and how the Hebrews escaped its curse.

A: What is Passover?

10 points:

Our Christmas usually lines up with this holiday celebrated worldwide by people from Africa.

A: What is Kwanzaa?



Round #1: Children (or easier)

2 points:

Eve was created from Adam's ribs. But Adam was created by God from this.

A: What is the dust of the earth?

4 points:

In the beginning, God created these two things first.

A: What are the heavens and the earth?

6 points:

The people of earth turned raunchy pretty quickly as recorded in Genesis, but God decided to save this man and his family from destruction of all life.

A: Who was Noah?

8 points:

Father Abraham was asked to sacrifice a son by this name, but the Lord intervened before he could do it.

A: Who was Isaac?

10 points:

According to Genesis 1:2&3, God actually created this before he created the sun.

A: What is the earth?



Round #2: Children (or easier)

2 points:

After leaving the garden, Adam and Eve conceived two sons, who went by these names.

A: Who are Cain and Abel?

4 points:

One of the first two sons of Adam killed the other. This one was the killer.

A: Who is Cain?

6 points:

According to Genesis 6:14, this kind of wood was used to build the Ark.

A: What is gopher wood?

8 points:

Noah was allowed to take his wife, three sons, and these three people onto the Ark, according to Genesis 6:18.

A: Who were Noah's daughters in law?

10 points:

Noah was this age when the flood waters came upon the earth.

A: What is 600 years?



Round #1: Adults (or harder)

2 points:

According to Genesis 7:12, the actual rain in the Great Flood lasted for this period of time.

A: What is 40 days (and 40 nights)?

4 points:

When Father Abraham was first told by God to move away from his birthplace, he was living in this land.

A: What is Ur?

6 points:

After Cain killed Abel, Eve became pregnant with a son by this name, who created the bloodline leading to Noah and eventually Israel.

A: Who was Seth?

8 points:

These strange characters from Genesis 6 are said to have been the offspring of the sons of God and the daughters of men.

A: Who were the nephilim?

10 points:

This character from Genesis 5 is said to have lived for more than 900 years.

A: Who is Methuselah?



Round #2: Adults (or harder)

2 points

Mentioned in the Bible only once, in Isaiah 14, this well-known master demon is said to have fallen out of heaven.

A: Who is Lucifer?

4 points:

This double-crossing woman in Judges 16 cost Samson his strength. She duped him into telling her that he'd be rendered powerless if his hair were ever cut.

A: Who was Delilah?

6 points

According to Genesis 7:24, waters flooded the earth for this period of time.

A: What is 150 days?

8 points

Noah had three sons, Shem, Ham, and Japheth. He cursed this one for disrespect, according to Genesis 9.

A: Who is Ham?

10 points:

Noah was the great grandfather of this astute character, who built the tower of babel.

A: Who was Nimrod?



Round #1: Children (or easier)

2 points:

According to 1 Peter 2:24, Jesus died as a sacrifice for this behavior, common to all mankind.

A: What are sins?

4 points:

The Holy Trinity can be defined as three entities.

A: Who are the Father, Son and Holy Spirit?

6 points:

These two women were the sisters of Lazarus, whom Jesus raised from the dead.

A: Who are Martha and Mary?

8 points:

The mother of these two disciples asked Jesus if they could sit on his right and left when he became king.

A: Who are James and John?

10 points:

Jesus' death on the cross happened during an eclipse and was immediately followed by this natural phenomenon, according to Matthew 27.

A: What is an earthquake?



Round #2: Children (or easier)

2 points:

At Jesus' birth in the manger, his mother wrapped him in rags, also known by this name.

A: What are swaddling clothes?

4 points:

When Jesus was tempted in the desert, he first went this many days without eating.

A: What is 40 days?

6 points:

Jesus was denied by this disciple three times after his arrest, in spite of the disciple swearing he would never do this.

A: Who is Peter?

8 points:

In Luke 18, Jesus saw a group of these and likened them to people in heaven.

A: What are children?

10 points:

Jesus began the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5 by saying that these people are blessed.

A: Who are the poor in spirit?



Round #1: Adults (or harder)

2 points:

According to Matthew 26, Judas Iscariot was paid this amount to betray Jesus.

A: What is 30 pieces of silver?

4 points:

In this parable told by Jesus in Luke 15, a son asks for his inheritance, spends it on wrong choices, comes home broke, and his father forgives him.

A: Who is the Prodigal Son?

6 points:

When Jesus walked on water, this disciple asked to come to him, and Jesus told him to come.

A: Who is Peter?

8 points:

This New Testament predecessor of Jesus, recorded in Matthew 3, is said to have eaten locusts and honey in the wilderness and to never have touched alcohol.

A: Who is John the Baptist?

10 points:

According to Matthew 14, when the disciples saw Jesus walking on water and before Jesus identified himself, the disciples thought he was one of these.

A: What is a ghost?



Round #2: Adults (or harder)

2 points:

Jesus raised this man from the grave, as recorded in John 11:39, after he had been dead for four days.

A: Who is Lazarus?

4 points:

During the Transfiguration, as recorded in Matthew 17, Jesus was seen talking to these two Old Testament prophets.

A: Who were Moses and Elijah?

6 points:

The two men crucified with Jesus had been accused of this crime.

A: What is theft?

8 points:

The first Christian Martyr, recorded in Acts 7, is this man.

A: Who is Stephen?

10 points:

A criminal was set free in exchange for Christ the day of the Crucifixion. He went by this name.

A: Who is Barabas?



Round #1: Children (or easier)

2 points:

Creating a Burning Bush was God's way of speaking to this famous Bible Hero.

A: Who is Moses?

4 points:

When Jesus was baptized, some people saw what appeared to be God's spirit descending on him, and they likened it to this creature.

A: What is a dove?

6 points:

When Jesus washed the disciple's feet at the Last Supper, this disciple objected most loudly according to John 13.

A: Who is Peter?

8 points:

Shadrach, Meshach and this man were thrown into the fiery furnace for not bowing down to King Nebuchadnez-zar's idols.

A: Who is Abednego?

10 points:

The prophet Jonah was delivered to this city by the giant fish.

A: What is Ninevah?



Round #2: Children (or easier)

2 points:

When John the Baptist saw the Jewish religious leaders of the day coming to be baptized, he was not pleased. He called them a "brood" of these.

A: What is a "brood of vipers?"

4 points:

Noah was this age when he entered the Ark, according to Genesis 7:11-13.

A: What is 600 years?

6 points:

As recorded in Numbers 20:11, Moses angered God with this particular sin he committed in the desert, when water gushed forth from a rock.

A: What is tapping twice?

8 points:

According to John 4, Jesus asked a woman for a drink at a well. She was a descendent of this place, known for a hostile relationship with Israel.

A: What is Samaria?

10 points:

Jesus is known to have made seven statements while on the Cross. This one is the shortest and has to do with water.

A: What is "I thirst?"



Round #1: Adults (or harder)

2 points:

This Apostle was shipwrecked in Acts 27 after imploring his captors not to set sail from Crete. However, those in charge listened to the ship's captain and not to him.

A: Who is Paul?

4 points:

In John 3:5, Jesus said that unless man be born of these two things, he cannot see God.

A: What is water and the spirit?

6 points:

According to Exodus 15, the Hebrews sang after the Red Sea swallowed and killed the Egyptian army. The poem they sang has commonly become known by this name.

A: What is the Song of Moses?

8 points:

In 1 Kings 18, the prophets of Baal thought Elijah's altar to the God of Israel would not light because it had been doused three times in this substance.

A: What is water?

10 points:

The Red Sea is not the only Bible story where waters parted. Joshua brought his army across water being held back by God before Israel's first invasion opposite this famous town.

A: What is Jericho?



Round #2: Adults (or harder)

2 points:

Jesus met the Samarian woman, according to John 4:6, at this place made famous by Jacob and his son Joseph:

A: What is Jacob's well?

4 points:

The River Jordan is most famous because of the work carried out there by this New Testament prophet.

A: Who is John the Baptist?

6 points:

John 5 reveals Jesus healing a man who kept trying to get into the pool of Bethesda, where an angel gave it great healing powers. Religious leaders nearby objected to the healing because it happened on this day.

A: What is the Sabbath?

8 points:

Jesus spoke in Matthew 13:38-40 about wheat being gathered up at the end of the age and saved. This second item would be thrown into the fire.

A: What are tares?

10 points:

In Genesis 9:11, the rainbow that appeared to Noah after the flood symbolized God's Covenant with man and the promise that this certain natural disaster would never again occur.

A: What is earth being destroyed by water?



Round #1: Children (or easier)

2 points:

The son of Adam and Eve, Abel, was bullied and killed by his brother known by this name.

A: Who is Cain?

4 points:

David felt confident about killing Goliath because he had already killed these two creatures, according to 1 Samuel 17:35.

A: What are a lion and a bear?

6 points:

The apostle Peter warns against this bully, saying he "roams the earth like a lion, seeking whom he may devour" (1 Peter 5:8)

A: Who is the devil?

8 points:

This king, in Daniel 6, realized too late he had been duped into putting Daniel in the lions' den.

A: Who is King Darius?

10 points:

This famous Psalm of David starts with "The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?"

A: What is Psalm 27?



Round #2: Children (or easier)

2 points:

At the Burning Bush, Moses was told to speak to this bully, to tell him to let the people of Israel go.

A: Who is Pharaoh?

4 points:

Moses had to flee Egypt as a young man after committing this crime, inspire by having seen an Egyptian beating up a Hebrew.

A: What is murder?

6 points:

Sarah, the wife of Abraham, was so mean to this woman that she had to take her son Ishmael and leave Sarah's house, according to Genesis 21.

A: Who is Hagar?

8 points:

Joseph was so bullied by his 11 older brothers that, as recorded in Genesis 37, they let him be sold as a slave in this country.

A: What is Egypt?

10 points:

According to Exodus 1, the Hebrews were so bullied by the Egyptians that they were told that any of their male newborns would be thrown into this river. It is the same river Moses floated down as an infant in a basket.

A: What is the Nile?



Round #1: Adults (or Harder)

2 points:

When David offered to kill Goliath, he was heckled by this relative according to 1 Samuel 17.

A: What is his older brother?

4 points:

In 1 Samuel 17:40, it is said that David picked up this many stones in order to slay Goliath.

A: What are five?

6 points:

In the famed Psalm 23, these two things are said to follow "all the days of your life" if you trust in God.

A: What are goodness and mercy?

8 points:

This leader planned to kill all babies under the age of two in Bethlehem. It caused Jesus' parents to escape to Egypt, where they remained until the leader's death.

A: Who is Herod?

10 points:

In Judges 9, Abimelech was dealt a fatal blow in battle by a woman after killing this many of his half-brothers so that he could be king.

A: What is seventy?



Round #2: Adults (or Harder)

2 points:

This man bullied and helped kill Christians until the Lord appeared to him on the Road to Damascus.

A: Who is the Apostle Paul?

4 points:

The saying, "I'll have your head on a platter" came from the martyrdom of this New Testament prophet, who was beheaded by Herod.

A: Who is John the Baptist?

6 points:

In the Book of Jude, Michael the Archangel was heckled by devil concerning the body of this Old Testament hero.

A: Who is Moses?

8 points:

After Jesus healed a man's hand as recorded in Matthew 12, this group of men plotted his murder.

A: Who were the Pharisees?

10 points:

This hideous woman in 2 Kings 9 sacrificed babies to a god of stone. She was eventually thrown from a window, trampled by horses, and eaten by dogs.

A: Who is Jezebel?



Round #1: Children (or easier)

2 points:

The name of the Messiah when he lived on earth was this.

A: What is Jesus?

4 points:

This being, also known as Lucifer, is the most evil life force on planet earth.

A: What is the devil? (or Satan?)

6 points:

In Revelation 22:13, Jesus says, "I am the Alpha and [this]."

A: What is the Omega?

8 points:

At its beginnings, Israel had no kings. They had this type of leader instead.

A: What is a judge?

10 points:

Jesus most famous sermon was delivered on one of these.

A: What is a Mount?



Round #2: Children (or easier)

2 points:

A star named after this Bible hero has six points and is often worn by people of the Jewish faith.

A: Who was David?

4 points:

This disciple was the older brother of the disciple John, who also wrote a book in the New Testament.

A: Who was James?

6 points:

A form of Biblical poetry, many of these were written by King David, either praising or beseeching God.

A: What is a Psalm?

8 points:

This son of Abraham was comforted in the death of his mother by meeting his wife, Rebekah, in Genesis 24.

A: Who is Isaac?

10 points:

The devil often disguises himself as an angel of light, but once in the Bible, he disguised himself as this animal.

A: What is a snake?



Round #1: Adults (or harder)

2 points:

This book contains 66 books within it and the writings of at least 40 authors.

A: What is the Bible?

4 points:

This hero was dumbfounded to find the people of Israel worshipping a golden calf when he returned from Mount Sinai.

A: Who is Moses?

6 points:

This word for the people of God is also used by many Catholics to denote people of great holiness and sacrifice.

A: Who are saints?

8 points:

There are no accounts in the Bible of these creatures actually having wings.

A: What are angels?

10 points:

If it weren't for sin having entered the world, men would never have to experience this strange phenomenon.

A: What is death?



Round #2: Adults (or harder)

2 points:

Two things are listed as comforting in Psalm 23; God's rod and this.

A: What is a staff?

4 points:

Jesus said in Matthew 17:20 that all you need is a mustard seed of this in order to move mountains.

A: What is faith?

6 points:

Jesus said in Matthew 6:18 not to lay up treasures for yourself in this place.

A: What is earth?

8 points:

The famous line from Matthew 7:7 states, "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find..." This comes next.

A: What is "Knock"?

10 points:

This first minor prophet in the Old Testament condemned Israel for worshipping false gods and was told to marry a harlot, to symbolize God's marriage to Israel.

A: Who is Hosea?



Tie Breakers or Final Jeopardy Rounds

Final Jeopardy will be identifying famous Bible verses, by naming the book, chapter and verse, such as "James 1:5." To garnish points, players should at least be able to name the Book in the Bible from which the scripture comes. Set points according to your desired level of difficulty.

For Children:

Scripture: The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.

A: What is Psalm 23:1?

Scripture: All have sinned; all fall short of the glory of God.

A: What is Romans 3:23?

Scripture: That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

A: What is Romans 10:9?

Scripture: For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

A: What is Romans 10:23?

Scripture: There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.

A: What is Romans 8:1?



For Adults:

Scripture: For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast

A: What is Ephesians 2:8-9?

Scripture: And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.

A: What is Acts 2:21?

Scripture: The Lord is my rock and my salvation. Whom shall I fear?

A: What is Psalm 27:1?

Scripture: But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God.

A: What is John 1:12?

Scripture: And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ.

A: What is Philippians 1:6?

Scripture: Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God."

A: What is John 3:3?

Scripture: If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

A: What is 1 John 1:9?
