Our AGM is fast approaching : Wednesday 19th of October at the Gulnare Bowling Club at 7.30pm followed by General Committee meeting.



Vale Margaret Waldhuter

The funeral service for Margaret Waldhuter, formerly Andrewartha, nee Whitehorn was recently held in Adelaide. Margaret passed away at the age of 96.

She was born in 1926 to times very different from today. After completing primary school at Koolunga, Margaret repeated year 7 in order to be old enough to leave school, education at a higher level was unavailable.... It was war time and with her father and brothers serving the country, she and her mother ran the farm, including seeding, on their own.

She married Reg Andrewartha and four children were born: Graham, Wendy, Dianne and Robyn. They ran their business at Brinkworth (Anne Green's current property) and later took on the Bungaree bus run. When this run ended, they took on the Secondary run to Blyth, picking up students going to Clare High, taking them to Blyth to connect and then returning to bring primary students back to Brinkworth. This was then quite a long route on outlying dirt roads. At that time, even the direct road link through Hart to Blyth was unsealed. Many people now in their late 30s and older will remember Mrs Andy driving the yellow bus. She would often have young grand children with her as she babysat them......There was a car seat that would be strapped to the seat next to her at the front of the bus so that the youngest could travel safely!

Margaret cared for Reg for many years and after his passing, she was still busy with family and was involved with many community activities. She had 50 years of service to Mothers and Babies (CAFHS) and Red Cross. She was a tower of strength in the Uniting church which also included running Sunday School and Youth Group. An avid sewer she made many garments for her family but also as fund raisers for the church. She made wedding and bridesmaid dresses for many.

Margaret re-married to Reg Waldhuter and after a time living in Blyth they retired to Adelaide. Here Margaret was once again very involved in her local community for many years, until Reg passed and her age caught up with her!

Margaret leaves behind her a wonderful family. The celebration of her life service was conducted by Jan Trengove. Jan told of Margaret's commitment and faith to her God. Many who attended re-lived many memories with her family and Margaret would have been very proud to see them happily re-kindling past friendships in her honour.
