Field Trip Report

There was no field trip in October.

Field Trip Info

The November 15th field trip will be to the petroglyphs on the Kaibab Paiute Reservation located near Kanab. This will be an all day trip. Bring a snack or lunch and plenty of water. There will be about a 2 mile round trip hike on a well-groomed trail. There is little or no scrambling required. Normal vehicles can be used.

You will be required to pay an entrance fee to Pipe Springs National Monument (NPS Park Passes are accepted) plus you will be required to pay a \$10 per person fee to the Paiute guide which goes to the Kaibab Paiute Reservation. There is a 20-person limit for this trip.

Remember, you must be a member of DAS to participate in a field trip. You must be at the meeting in order to sign up for a field trip.
