Low water fishing is now open once again for Ormers and other shellfish on the rocks and dark patches of sand along the coast. The laying of low water nets is now also open. With the air temperature remaining comparatively high throughout the evening and with the seawater temperature at eighteen centigrade laying a net could be an enjoyable excursion out with a few friends before the long winter evenings set in.

The St. Aubin Petanque pitch is now completely finished and Mark has been testing his throw. He assured me that the surface bounce was just perfect and that passing traffic should not be concerned about stray balls.
