- For the conversion of Christians, especially those of our parishes.


Visit and Distribution of Holy Communion to parishioners in St. Claude Pavilion: Every Wednesday afternoon from 1:30 – 3:30 PM.

Brothers and sisters,

As we approach the Holy Week, we experience in a deeper way the love of God for us. The dying in humiliation of Jesus on the cross is the most powerful evidence of his unconditional love for humanity. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16). Yes, Jesus died for us. He died for you and for me, sinners. He died and resurrected so that we may have life and have it abundantly. "O give thanks to

the LORD, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever" (Psalm 136:1).

Receiving God's mercy and forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation is the best way for you to prepare for the Holy Week when we celebrate the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord. Therefore, I would like to invite all of you to attend the Days of Confession and Eucharistic Adoration in our parishes:

- **In St. Claude: Thursday March 25: 9:00Am: Mass; 10:00am-4:00pm: Confessions.**
- **In St. Denis: Friday: March 26: 9:00Am: Mass; 10:00am-4:00pm: Confessions.**

**In addition, if you want to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, please call me for an appointment. I am super happy to make myself available for your spiritual well-being.*
