4. Watch Educational Video. - United Nations UNICEF 17 SDGs video. Have students to write a one-page paper on (1) chosen goal.


5. **17 SDGs Animal Ambassadors** - Familiarize students with the 17 SDGs real-life animal ambassadors.Names; QiQi & Diandian



Note: The United Nations Association of the United States of America (UNA-USA) is a movement of Americans dedicated to supporting the United Nations. With over 20,000 members (60% under the age of 26) and more than 200 chapters across the country, UNA-USA members are united in their commitment to global engagement and their belief that each of us can play a part in advancing the UN's mission and achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.

Submission Requirements:

*All participants must register and submit student and new membership form. Participants can register online by visiting one of the three listed websites - 1. www.dwgreeninstitute.org 2. dwcommunicationsandmedia.org 3. www.una-spsc.org.

*Please remember to include at least (2) primary contacts on registration form.

*All middle and high school registration must be a group of students (School sets criteria for grouping students.)

*All middle and high school student groups must have a lead instructor, coach, or mentor to guide and advice the group. All collegiate entries can be determined individually and do not have to be a group registration.

*Each school can submit more than one registration.

*After clear review and understanding of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) student's need to choose a category for their project.

*One category per registration. Categories: HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS, PERFORMING ARTS / MEDIA PRODUCTION, STEM/STEAM and SPORTS

*All participants must submit a release statement (available on website(s) that give permission to publish materials pertaining to the

competition. ex. photos, articles, videos, interviews.

*Participants are challenge to create a clear and concise message that symbolizes, displays understanding, and relevance of the 17 SDGs. Participants are encourage to be innovated and creative ex. a banner, sign, billboard, button, sticker, painting, morale, video, skit, short film, beautiful canvas, poem, drawing. coloring book, color wheel display, 17 SDGs blocks. sports venue.

*All entries must have the title: Annual Youth International Energy & Environment Program (YIEEP) 17 SDGs National Competition.

*All projects must use Times Roman font - size 12. to 14.

*All work must be the original work of the student(s) registered in each group.

*Each entry must be a clear and concise display of understanding, supporting, and advocating for the 17 SDGs.

Each submission must encompass the following elements when working on 17 SDGs project(s):

2. Do I understand the 17 SDGs?

3. How can working on the 17 SDGs help the world?
