We will also introduce writing to inform. New sight/heart words will go home this evening. Please continue with your nightly reading and practicing sight words. 1st/2nd: This week first grade will continue discussing verbs and nouns while adding adjectives. Second grade will be working on digraphs this week and bossy Rs. First grade will begin discussing matter in science and second grade will begin a unit on dinosaurs and fossils. Both classes will have a math test and a spelling test on Friday. Please remember to read for your AR tests as well. Several students haven't even started! Have a great week! - Mrs. Hird

3rd/4th: This week our class will be working on writing sentences. We will be focusing on a variety of things from varying sentence lengths, subject/verb agreement, capitalization, punctuation, and paragraph formation. Fourth grade has a writing section on our MAP tests. This will help prepare them for that. By now, my fourth graders should be using cursive handwriting on their assignments, except for spelling. Mrs. Foster requires students to use cursive in her class and practice makes perfect. We will also continue to work on our multiplication facts. Third grade will have a science test over chapter 9 on Wednesday. Study guides have already been completed and should be going home nightly. Third

graders will also have a math test on Thursday. Have a great week! - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: In Writing, 5th and 6th graders will review personification and hyperbole before starting new poems next week. In Science, 5th grade will be reading about gravity, friction, and magnetism and 6th grade will start a new chapter on sound. In English, 5th grade will practice with pronouns and 6th grade will learn how to use quotations correctly. In Reading, both grades will continue in their Buckledown and C.A.R.S. workbooks and will also be typing their book reports. In Social Studies, 5th grade will have a test over Ch. 2 on Friday and 6th grade will be getting ready to test over Ch. 4 early next week. 6th grade will also test over U.S. Presidents #1-30 on Friday. **7/8 Comm. Arts:** Students need to have their book read for their book report by this Friday and they will also have a figurative language test on Friday.

5/6 Math: In 5th grade, students have been working on decimals in the form of metric equivalencies, reading and writing decimal numbers correctly, and determining the mathematical rules behind certain patterns. In 6th grade, students are working with the nature of angles, area and volume, and more difficult problems involving order of operations.

Tests This Week: 5th/6th Math Vocabulary Test: Thursday

7th/8th: This week, we will be working out of our Health series. In 7th grade, students will be learning about various aspects related to physical fitness. Eighth graders will be working on the importance of forming responsible relationships. In math, 7th grade will be working on the nature of angles, story problems involving proportions, and applying scientific notation. In pre-algebra, students will be working on more difficult order of operations, the nature of algebraic terms, and more difficult equations. In algebra, we are working on types of problems which will challenge our knowledge of the different number families and simplifying radical expressions.
