We will be working on division facts and extra practice on our grammar. We will have our normal schedule in spelling with a test on Friday. Third grade will have a science test on Tuesday over chapter 14. They will also have a math test on Thursday. Fourth grade will have a science test over chapter 14 on Monday, May 10th. 5th/6th: 5th and 6th graders will continue working through daily Geography this week and will practice finding latitude and longitude coordinates on a map. In Science, 5th grade will test over Ch. 18 on Friday and 6th grade will test over Ch. 4 on Friday. Both grades will be finishing their C.A.R.S. and Buckledown workbooks in Reading. In Social Studies, 5th grade will be getting ready to test over the Civil War next Tuesday, May 11th and 6th grade will finish a unit on Ancient Rome.

7/8 Comm. Arts: Students will be reading about argument and persuasion in their Lit. textbooks and will also look at a short story called "The Count of Monte Cristo". Have a great week and don't forget, **pop tabs are due this Friday!**

7th/8th: I wanted to first take the opportunity to say I enjoyed seeing the science projects and hope the students got a lot out of them. This week, we will be finishing up our latest health chapters and we'll finish up the school year working on skills related to interpreting data based on earth science topics. In social studies, seventh grade will be looking at global events and topics of the second half of the 20th century while the eighth grade will be closing out the year with the events of the Civil War. **Tests this Week: 7th/8th Health: Wednesday**

5-8 Math: In fifth grade, students are learning about the nature of negative numbers and identifying ratios. In sixth grade, students are learning about the angle measures of triangles and quadrilaterals. In seventh grade, students are looking at different types of equations and area and circumference of semicircles. In pre-algebra, students are looking at more complex transformations and the beginnings of quadratic equations. In algebra, students are factoring algebraic denominators to discover common denominators.
