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A BASIC INTRODUCTION:

Predicated upon this year's sub-theme theme, "February: A Season of LOVE Manifested!," LOVE is the "INTEGRAL" that guides one's input into this topic, etc. [in other words 1) what one thinks; 2) what one says; 3) what one does – then, eventually - the output (Appreciation, Positive Reaction, Positive Application of what was learned as a result of the cultural awareness of persons who are members of his/her neighborhood, community, school, church, etc.)]. During the year LMMI would like its participants to become more conscious of persons "different" from himself/herself. The "LOVE" talked of in the February Theme will "become this INTEGRAL!"

For LMMI, "African American/Black History: A Cultural Awareness Experience" will officially begin in January – with the Study of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. – and others – throughout the year!

OBJECTIVE:

To develop an awareness and appreciation of/for persons "different from oneself' - realizing this can be done/MANIFESTED through having the LOVE of GOD within his/her heart! Especially/Heavily, involve children, teens, and youth in these Activities, Projects, Events, etc.

BACKGROUND:

Because of its unending volumes of information – most untold, unheard of, etc., LMMI finds it essential that <u>ALL</u> persons know the history, accomplishments, contributions, etc. of a people brought to America from Africa without choice (Why?; How?; Purpose?; For what?; Results – THEN? NOW?).

LMMI does not want to "study African American History/Black History..." only in the month of February – rather, preferring it to begin with the study of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in January, *THEN*, addressing the topic throughout the year.

(NOTE: Positive Awareness/Recognition/Contributions of other ethnic groups may be done, as well. Instead of "African American History/Black History," the topic would reflect the culture of the particular ethnic group being recognized)

SOME SUGGESTIONS ARE HEREWITH, LISTED; THERE ARE MULTITUDES MORE.

You are invited to list others, preferably, with your own creative expressions of deliverance.

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YOUR TASK:

Develop non-traditional strategies, etc. for implementing the wording in this Document's INTRODUCTION and OBJECTIVE, resulting in a **POSITIVE OUTCOME**.

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SUGGESTION ONE: "UNSUNG" and "OTHER HEROES"

*"<u>UNSUNG HEROES</u>" are those persons who have done outstanding feats, but no one knows it, or "haven't paid attention to this 'low-key' person." Look in your family, neighborhood, community, church, school, etc. - for persons who have had an impact upon others in some manner. Choose a "deserving person" whom you think should be recognized for his/her DEED and/or LEGACY.

"OTHER HEROES" would refer to "Lesser Known Persons" and/or "Well-

known Persons" ("FIRSTS," Pioneers, Inventors, etc. – living or deceased - with accommodating information, as above.

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#1 – The Project: Begin recognitions with the eldest adult(s) from **YOUR OWN** family and/or church/neighborhood/community/organization – who have made noteworthy contributions/achievements/accomplishments - in any area - of which many persons are unaware (but should be made aware).

#2 - Organizers: (as Millennials, etc.)

- A) Formulate Committees; include specific assignments needed.
- B) Locate "Unsung and Other Heroes."

#3 - Procedures/Specifics:

A. . Research:

- His/her life/Legacy, including his/her family life; his/her hardships/struggles; education; influencers; writings/ inventions; achievements/accomplishments; contributions to the lives of others, etc.
- 2) What other information would you want others to know regarding this person?

[NOTE: Items 3 – 5 can be participatory projects for other *HEROES*; choose setup]

- 3) What applications from this person's Life/Legacy can you make to Your own life? [can be a participatory project].
- 4) What is your <u>"Take-Away"</u> from this research?
- 5) How will you present your findings to others?
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B) Gather information/visuals, etc. about each "HERO:"

Advertisements, then Presentations through:
Church bulletins; Books; special programs; hard/soft
media [protecting confidentiality, etc.]; Church Services;
Community Events, Interviews; Honorariums/gifts/cards, etc.

C) Organize/Do the specific details, including deciding when/ where/how recognitions will be done; family/friends \ attendees; program participants; invited guests; other attendees; etc..

#4 - Implement your Project or Program.

How will this be done?

How often will it be done?

#5 - Evaluate your Project or Program.

NOTE: African American History/Black History does not have to culminate at the end of February – nor does it have to occur only during one month of the year.

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SUGGESTION TWO: READING and RESEARCH of Unsung,

Lesser-Known and/or Well-known African Americans/Blacks

- a) via 1) Person; 2) Her/His Life; 3) What she/he invented, etc.;

- b) via accomplishments through research, writings, etc.;

SUGGESTION SIX: On Youth Sundays??, recognize "*HERO*" **Do one or more of the following:**

- Conduct "INTERVIEW" [using information collected from "RESEARCH." Advertise via hard and soft media; family, community,
- 2) Invite special persons for "TRIBUTES."
- 3) Distribute <u>"PROGRAMONES"</u> to attendees [See 'RESEARCH"]
- 4) Present Certificate and/or Gift to "HERO."
- 5) Do write-ups for Church Bulletins; Mail-outs; Newspapers, Radio, Announcements, etc.
- 6) Etc.

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SUGGESTION SEVEN: Participate in "...LOCAL CHURCH NEIGHBORHOOD/COMMUNITY-BASED INIATIVES," as

- 1) <u>"A BACK-TO-SCHOOL..." OR "STAY IN SCHOOL INITIATIVE"</u>
- 2) "TAKE TIME FOR KIDS (TEENS AND YOUTH, TOO!)"
- 3) "FOCUS ON CHILDREN, TEENS, AND YOUTH"
