### \*The Prayer of Adoration

- Q33. Why is the Lord Jesus Christ called God's "only begotten Son" when we also are God's children?
- A33. Because Christ alone is the eternal, natural Son of God. We, however, are adopted children of God—adopted by grace for the sake of Christ.
- Q34. Why do you call Him "our Lord"?
- A34. Because not with gold or silver, but with his precious blood he has delivered and purchased us body and soul from sin and from the tyranny of the devil, to be his very own.

# The Confession of Sin

O gracious and gentle God who has welcomed us into your household having made peace with us by the blood of Christ on the cross: you are the God of peace, the Father of mercy, and the God of all comfort.

Yet we must confess before you the evil of our hearts; we confess we have sinned before you by what we have done and what we have left undone.

We have not kept your commandments or your statutes. We confess we have often offended you, our loving and generous Father by our sins.

We confess our hearts still tend too much toward anger and jealousy rather than contentment and joy in Christ. We confess we are too comfortable with our selfish ambition and pride. O spare use from bitterness and suspicion in our heart and show us your abundant mercy.


Please forgive us our sins and permit us to partake of the blessing you have promised to all who seek your grace through Jesus Christ, our Lord. The Silent Confession




