

#### Unapproved Holcombe Ad Council minutes Sept. 9, 2019

Present: Pastor Paul, Liz Dempsey, Mary Beede, Cheryl Bingham, Bonnie Gundlach, Sue Dahlstrom,

Jennifer Heidtke, Bill Stimeling, Carla Ingalls

Liz opened with part of the Adult Sunday School program having to do with the spiritual practices of mindfulness, listening and silence. She then mentioned a grant program available for putting on events she found on the enews for possibly applying for Madrigal.

**Minutes:** Bonnie moved to accept August minutes, Mary second, approved.

Bill asked to bring up two things before returning to Madrigal practice, one being a church Covenant. He contacted Dan Dick who will help us with that after Christmas, with Dan in pulpit one Sunday and ½ hour after to get it signed.

The second thing was regarding the Calendar of Events to be planned for next year. He would gather together persons to help with the planning once the kitchen process has been set up.

**Finance:** Bonnie will need to establish a budget meeting after the Charge Meeting which Pastor announced would be October 13th at 6:30 p.m. In other words a preliminary budget will be offered, to be finalized by December.

**<u>SPRC</u>**: Met, approved funding for office furniture.

Pictorial photographer set up. Will receive 8X10" and a directory. Packages will be offered, they are expensive, \$5 off if donate to food pantry. Pictures taken at Holcombe in January. Pictorial will include all three Churches in their own sections.

Treasurer: Carla stated we received a Thank You from Conference for donations to Mujila Falls.

Change of churches insurance policy for Food Pantry presence as they have received their own 501(c)3.

\$60 charge by bank for Food Pantry records.

Odanah donation came back as undeliverable, Carla checking on correct mailing address.

Sue motioned to accept report, second by Bonnie, approved.

Barbara Certa-Werner, District Superintendant has taken on the auditing of Food Pantry records herself as both Rog Paulsen and Roger Sharp declined the duty. Sue motioned and Jennifer second to pay Carla \$60 for the 3.5 hours she spent on the Food Pantry problem solving. Approved and our Thanks! Carla left the meeting.

**Worship:** World-wide Communion Sunday to be celebrated with a world map for congregates to post their country of origin on. **Missions:** Cheri announced baby bottle fundraiser is done and food for the food pantry collection has started. To be followed by school items collection. Then the Christmas family.

\$105 was collected at a Camaraderie Club meeting breakfast here at church. \$55 went to send Troop boxes. And \$50 to us to use in January for hats and mittens at the school.

Bonnie suggested "Flag Day Follies" have 2 or 3 acts with donations going to help send Troop boxes. And maybe included a Sunday's collection to be added to that. Change of name to Patriotic Follies was suggested and will be put in agenda for next 4-5 months to keep on track. Date was suggested, voted and approved for June 27th, 2020.

<u>Kitchen:</u> Jennifer announced for funerals, there will be three menus offered, 1) chicken and biscuit dinner, 2) sandwich and salad lunch or 3) lasagna hotdish dinner or a fourth choice of having a meal catered into the church. Supervision of cooking and purchases of supplies will be made by Jennifer.

Jennifer suggested divided plates would work better in future. Liz working on purchases itemized list for purchasing supplies for church use.

Lions Club bake sale went well, over \$1000.00 Collected for new Food Pantry. Thanks to all that contributed by baking and buying. Bill rejoined meeting.

<u>Trustees:</u> Sue notified council two doors should be purchased for the garage and that they should be prehung for easier installation. Bill motioned to purchase said doors with a second by Bonnie, approved.

Sue to get bids on cost of blacktop replacement, whole and partial. To be used as baseline for fundraising purposes.

Windows need refinishing, but this was not a good year due to high humidity, so possibly next August and will need many hands to get done!

**Nominations:** Bill volunteered to serve on this committee and recommended Jeff Anders, Jennifer Heidtke and Sue Dahlstrom as helpers with Pastor.

<u>Ministry Plan</u>: Pastor needs a copy and we will get on updating after Pastor gets settled-- on a Sunday afternoon, possibly at Stimelings.

October and November meetings to start at 4:30 p.m. due to Madrigal practice.

Next meeting 10/10/2019, 4:30.
