
New Storm Windows



ENTRANCE HYMN (Psalm 1:1-3)

Priest: Happy those who do not follow the counsel of the wicked, nor go the way of sinners, nor sit in company with scoffers. Rather, the law of the Lord is their joy; God's law they study day and night.


