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## Ghe Visible Church (25.2)

The visible church, which is also catholic or universal under the gospel (not confined to one nation, as before under the law), consists of all those throughout the world that profess the true religion; and of their children: and is the kingdom of the Lord Jesus Christ, the house and family of God, out of which there is no ordinary possibility of salvation.

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## Ghe Visible Church (25.2)

- Membership: those who are members of invisible church will seek out membership in visible church
  - Letters of NT largely written to churches, pastors
  - Believers and their children
- Why Children: born church members by virtue of birth or adoption into believing household
- I Cor 7:13-15, If any woman has a husband who is an unbeliever, and he consents to live with her, she should not divorce him. For the unbelieving busband is made holy because of his wife, and the unbelieving wife is made holy because of her husband. Otherwise your children would be unclean, but as it is, they are holy...
