The FHRC Membership List began in 2009 when we offered a wide range of annual membership levels. Later, we decided to recognize those who joined at the Preserver, Guardian, and Gatekeeper levels as Lifetime Members.

We offer a special word of thanks to our 47 Lifetime Members for sharing our vision and strengthening the organization. Half of the money is invested for future needs and half is used for current cemetery expenses. And, we are grateful for your support of special projects.

We continue to welcome and appreciate every member who joins for one or more years. We currently have 127 Annual Renewal Members who have maintained membership for consecutive years. In 2012 we launched a grassroots Capital Campaign to raise \$350,000 for the renovation of the chapel/office building at the Market Street entrance to the cemetery. During this time some members made do-

nations to the Capital Campaign instead of renewing their memberships.

A cemetery the size of Riverview (42 acres) requires many resources. We have no paid employees and rely on volunteers and partnerships to keep operating expenses low. We do not pay for grass cutting and tree work (see "Partners" tab on website). Snacks and beverages for volunteers are also

We do pay for property insurance, groundhog removal, a portable toilet on site, mulch and weed killer, gravel for potholes, flagpole maintenance and replacement flags, repair of roads and fence, repair of mausoleum, website design and maintenance, newsletter printing and postage, and temporary grave markers. All expenses are associated with our mission to operate, maintain, restore, and preserve Riverview Cemetery.
