



Apply to College High School Seniors



- Important time of the year for seniors and parents.
- There is a sense of urgency applying to colleges.
- ✤ Recommend applying to colleges in the <u>FALL</u> of senior year.
- Strong emphasis on academic performance due to COVID-19.
 - College admissions
 - Merit-based scholarships
 - ✤ NCAA Eligibility

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Apply to College Readiness Assessment for Seniors

- 1. What are your top 5 colleges?
 - What are the admissions requirements for each college?
 - What is the application fee for each college?
 - What is the cost of attendance for each college?
- 2. What are the top 2 majors you are considering?
- 3. How do you obtain your official high school transcript?
- 4. Which colleges require an essay for admissions? And on what topic(s)?
- 5. Who have you identified to write letters of recommendation?
- 6. Have you taken (or plan to take) the SAT/ACT?
- 7. How do you plan to pay for college?
- 8. True or False. Your social media behavior and online reputation does not matter.

Apply to College General College Planning Strategies


- ✤ Use your summers to get ahead.
- Start early and manage your time wisely.
- ✤ Get organized.
 - Create folders for college planning documents.
 - Save account/pw information in a central place.
 - Create a separate email address for college efforts.
- Take advantage of online resources.
- ✤ Be diligent and deliberate.
 - Send via certified mail and/or delivery receipt.
 - Confirm all your info received.
- Create a budget.
- Develop and execute a college plan.

Apply to College Senior Checklist

- □ Keep your grades up!
- Develop/update your Scholar Profile
- □ Take or re-take the SAT and ACT (if applicable)
- □ Select 1-2 college majors or fields of study
- □ Select your top colleges (5-10 colleges recommended)
- □ Research college requirements
- □ Write college essays (if applicable)
- □ Request your official high school transcript(s)
- □ Request and obtain letters of recommendation
- □ Apply to colleges and pay application fees
- □ Track college application decision results
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online (send results to top 3-5 schools) October 1st or after
 Selective Service sign-up (males 18 and up)
- □ Search and apply for scholarships and track decision results

Apply to College Types of Schools/Colleges

- Public college:
 - Primarily funded by a state government.
 - ✤ Generally larger than private schools.
 - In-state students pay in-state tuition
 - Out-of-state students living out of state likely pay more tuition
- Private
 - ✤ Often operates as an educational, non-profit organization.
 - Does not receive primary funding from a state government.
 - ✤ One tuition rate (whether in-state or out-of-state).


Research and Visit Colleges Choosing the Right College

- Find a college that fits your personality, background, interest and goals.
- Consider affordability (the cost of attendance & how much you can pay).
- Visit campuses (in-person and virtual tours)
- Rank the college factors that are important to you:
 - Courses and degree programs.
 - ✤ Location of school from home (especially after COVID-19).
 - ✤ Campus size.
 - Ratio of students to teachers.
 - Traditional, distance learning, or blended.
- Research colleges and compile a list of college admission requirements & costs. <u>(Recommend top 5-10 colleges)</u>
- Use an online search tool to help you research colleges

Apply to College College Application Parts



- Research colleges to understand requirements (tuition, test scores, majors, etc.)
- Ways to apply:
 - Electronically (create an account through a web portal)
 - ✤ By mail
- ✤ College application fee varies for each college (\$35 \$100)

Apply to Colleges The Common Application (App) www.commonapp.org

- Students can submit one college applications to about 900 colleges.
- Create an account/profile and then search colleges.
- ✤ Research and <u>apply</u> to multiple colleges through one website portal.
- ✤ New application opens on August 1st of each year.
- ✤ Reused when applying for multiple colleges on the site.
- ✤ Applicants can use the Common App for free.
- ✤ Each college may have an application fee (varying amounts).
- Roughly 45% of participating schools do not charge an application fee.



Apply to College The Common Black College Application (App) www.commonblackcollegeapp.com

- Students can submit one college applications to about 55 HBCUs.
- Create an account and apply to multiple colleges for about \$20.
- Select your top HBCUs to apply.
- Upload your test scores.
- Research and apply to multiple colleges through one website.
- Reused when applying for multiple colleges on the site.

Apply to College Official Transcripts

- Formal copies of a student's official high school academic grades have grades from freshman to junior year.
- ✤ Know the process to request transcripts and follow it precisely.
- ✤ Request transcripts at least 10-14 days before deadlines.
- Parental permission may be required at your high school prior to requesting transcripts.
- Request to have official high school transcripts for all of the colleges you applied to.
- * Most high schools will either mail or email your official transcripts to colleges.
- Double check with the colleges to verify receipt by the deadline, and followup with your high school.

Apply to College Essay Writing Guidance



- ✤ Be yourself and share about a personal experience.
- ✤ Reflect on who you are: strengths, talents, interests.
- Demonstrate knowledge of college/entity (facts/statistics).
- Share how you will make a difference.
- ✤ Ask for help (get a mentor).
- Brainstorm to generate ideas and be creative.
 - ✤ Can save you time.
 - Write down every idea/thought.
 - ✤ Highlight useful ideas that support the essay topic.

Apply to College Essay Writing Guidance

- Develop a brief outline to organize your thoughts into manageable sections.
 - Introduction (include a thesis statement)
 - Body (three main points)
 - Conclusion
- You may pick a topic or instructed to write on a particular topic.
- Ten common essay themes include:

Career/Major	Contribution	
Challenges	Creativity	
Change	Financial need	
Character	Leadership	
Community Service	Personal Statement

Apply to College Letters of Recommendation

- Request letters of recommendation for:
 - College applications
 - Scholarship applications
- Who should you ask for letters?
 - Teachers (establish a rapport during the school year)
 - School Counselors
 - Coaches
 - Employers
 - Community Leaders
- Tailor your ask for the type of college/scholarship application.
- Request multiple copies and ask for generic letters that can be reused.
- Make a list of recommenders that you trust and who will provide a positive reference but keep an ongoing list.

Type of Institution	Average Undergraduate Direct Costs 2017-2018
Public (in state)	\$25,290
Public (out of state)	\$40,940
Private (non-profit)	\$50,900

- The cost of attendance:
 - Increases each year (inflation)
 - ✤ May vary due to COVID-19 impacts and distance learning
- Some colleges are more expensive than others.
- ✤ Go where you can afford!!


