He was a student at the Don Bosco Institute in Lahore: the Pope's declaration was on the feast of Don Bosco, 31 January. He was 20 when he blocked a suicide bomber from entering St John's Church in Lahore on 15 March 2015.

The archbishop of Lahore said: "He gave his life to save more than 1,000 people in the church for Sunday Mass."

His last words were: "I will die, but I won't let you in."
