

Diplomate Credentialing Status: North American Spine Institute

Credentialing is a mark of approval by the North American Spine Institute, internationally accredited by Medical Schools and Chiropractic Schools for continuing education in 29 countries. This credentialing indicates that the attendee has achieved recommended standards of professional development and experience in Whiplash Traumatology and Treatment, including an understanding of Best Practice Clinical Practice Assessment and Treatment Guidelines.

Credentialing is not Board Certification, medical specialty status, or academic degree, and must not be claimed as such.

The only type of credentialing for qualified doctors is a Diplomate in Whiplash Traumatology and Treatment - DWTT.

DIPLOMATE CREDENTIALING

Credentialing is a mark of approval by the North American Spine Institute in which the doctor has achieved recommended standards of professional development and experience in Whiplash Traumatology, Neurophysiology, Pain Management and Multidisciplinary Treatment Approaches to Care.

RECREREDENTIALING

The term of Credentialing or of Advanced Credentialing is four years, following which the doctor must resubmit proof of current licensure from their respective regulatory body and evidence of 100 hours of Whiplash Traumatology Training and Educational activities.

FEE'S

For accreditation, the doctor must attend all 4 Whiplash Traumatology, Neurophysiology, Pain and Treatment Seminar Series: A Multidisciplinary Approach to Care seminar modules and pass the advanced credentialing test with a mark of 80% or better.

There is a \$100.00 administrative fee for testing.
