Preschool: We have been working hard on our names! We are switching to lined paper this week to get used to where our letters need to be. Last week we drew snowmen in shaving cream and painted snowmen with marshmallows. This week we will talk about animals that hibernate and how much they eat to prepare for their sleep. Kind: This week we are learning all about Polar Bears! Our vocabulary words are arctic, cub, den, float, and snatch. In phonics, we will be learning about both sounds /ee/ and /or/. Please don't forget to be checking folders nightly for homework and to sign when you are reading. Thank you! - **Mrs. Stewart**

1st/2nd: Back to 5 days this week! Our spelling test for both 1/2 will be on Wednesday. Both 1/2 have a math test on Friday. In 1st grade we will read the story, Duck! Rabbit!, by Amy Krouse Rosenthal. We will be talking about point of view in, and comparing stories. In grammar we will work on verbs and the ou/ow vowel sound in words. In math we will start adding 2-digit numbers without regrouping, identifying how many more on a graph, congruent shapes and grouping things in ten. In 2nd grade we will be reading the story, Snow Day, by Ezra Jack Keats. We will work on summarizing the story and again learning the lesson of a story (discussing different reasons authors write books as we did last week). In grammar we will learn the difference between singular/plural nouns and past/present verbs. In math we will be working on comparing numbers using the greater/less than symbol. This can sometimes be confusing, so we will hit this pretty hard. We will also continue working on fractions. - **Mrs. Thomas**

3rd/4th: Welcome back after this chilly weekend. I hope you were able to find some time to relax for at least a little while. With that being said, our class will jump right into the swing of things again this week. There will be several tests this week. Please use the study guides that came home last week. Today, both grades STAR tested. Third grade will have a science test on Tuesday. Fourth grade will have their science test on Wednesday. Fourth grade will take a math test on Tuesday. Both grades will have a test over their week 15 Missouri Studies. We will also have our normal spelling test on Friday. Students should also be working on their math facts and reading for AR nightly. Please let me know, if you have any questions. - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: In Writing, 5th and 6th graders will be looking at hyperbole and onomatopoeia for practice with figurative language. In Science, 5th grade will start a new lesson on "simple machines" and 6th grade will begin a chapter on "sound". In Reading, both grades will continue working through C.A.R.S. and Buckledown workbooks. In Social Studies, 5th grade will be getting ready to test early next week over Ch. 3 and will have a label Canada test next Wed., Feb. 1st. Sixth grade will finish Ch. 4 and have a U.S. Presidents test over #1-40 this Friday.

5th - 8th Grade Reading Requirements: Students should have their Book Report book read by this Friday, Jan. 27th. Next week we will begin working on book reports! **7th / 8th Comm. Arts:** Students will continue their poetry unit this week with some research over famous poets. They will work in their C.A.R.S. and Buckledown workbooks as well. Have a wonderful week! - Mrs. Foster

5/6 Math: This week, students in fifth grade will be looking at aspects of area, including its formula, decimal operations, and length conversions. In sixth grade, students are working on exponents, working with powers of 10, and fraction/decimal/percent equivalencies. **Tests This Week:** 5th and 6th Math: Friday **7/8:** In social studies, seventh grade is looking at the various early encounters different European groups had in the Americas. In eighth grade, students have moved on to the first decade of the 19th century, and we will be looking at the events of the administration of Thomas Jefferson. As we are between chapters in science, we will continue working in our health books this week. In seventh grade, students are looking at what goes into good decision-making.
