When we first learned it was time to find a new rector for St. Marks, Peter Macon pulled me aside and said, "I know it doesn't feel this way now, but this process will be one of the most spiritual endeavors you and the Vestry will ever undertake." I thought he was nuts.

Like all of us, we were stunned at the unexpected departure of Rev. Sarah, our long-time spiritual leader, and shortly thereafter Rev. Matt, the spiritual guide of our children. We weren't able to gather because of a terrifying virus we still didn't know much about. And hugs? Out of the question. So, to hear that the process of finding Sarah's replacement would be anything but a terrifying chore seemed a ridiculous pipe dream.

Things started out rough. Losing a strong rector leaves a leadership vacuum that needs to be filled with intention. We flailed a bit, but we prayed. It wasn't long before we found our footing and began to make wise decisions that allowed us to hear the Holy Spirit loud and clear.

We knew it was important to talk to you first, before we did anything else. Through the parish survey and eight Congregational Conversations, you gave us a clear picture of who you want to lead us forward. We listened carefully for themes and traits, skills and characteristics. You were superb in guiding our process and plans.

As our work progressed, the North Star you set for us burned clear and bright. The Holy Spirit took hold of our hearts and helped us walk forward together into a process that was both challenging and spirit-filled.

In May, we received a slate of candidates from Bishop Sam, a handful of spiritual leaders as different from each other as seemed possible. The Holy Spirit's message was clear: If you have trouble choosing from among these candidates, you haven't done enough work discerning what St. Marks is looking for, go back and pray some more.

We conducted candidate visits in a decidedly St. Marks fashion, eschewing the diocesan suggestions of how to structure them in favor of ways that would help us learn who our candidates are and help them learn who St. Marks is. We took them hiking and kayaking and pottery painting. Flyin' Lion

prepared lovely, simple dinners for us to serve over lengthy and candid conversation. We met with the candidates collectively and in small groups. Some of us were fortunate enough to have one-on-one time.

The Vestry gathered for our first conversation just hours after the last candidate left us, talking well into the night. It was a lively, spirited conversation filled with laughter and love. We took time again to review your guidance and we looked deep into our own hearts. We experienced none of the contention we were told to expect. There was dissent, of course, but it was thoughtful and kind and respectful. And we listened closely to every voice.

After that first discernment conversation, we scattered to the winds on vacations we had postponed because of the candidate search. While we were apart, we prayed. And prayed. And prayed some more.

When we gathered once again, the Holy Spirit's imprint on the process had become crystal clear. It was, at least for me and I suspect for others, among the most spiritual endeavors I've ever undertaken. If you're reading this before Aug. 1, I hope you'll come to services that day, or tune in, to hear the rest of the story. If you're reading this after Aug. 1, the big news is out.

Either way, I pray your hearts and minds are prepared for a burst of spiritual energy and growth, a recommitment to outreach and to making Christ known in the world, and a whole bunch of fellowship and fun.

Peace be with you, my brothers and sisters in Christ. I can't wait to be with you all again soon.
